

Summary of Likes:

There were a lot of things which participants liked about this area, for example:

Use of marble and polished granite; lots of historic buildings; Old Post Office; feels hidden away; some parts rather elegant; easily accessible; quiet in places; good architecture; formal houses; Riley's Pool Hall; links to Union Street.

Summary of Dislikes:

There were however things that participants didn't like, for example:

Too many CCTV cameras; dark alleys and tunnels; noisy; dirty; cramped; lack of building maintenance; unwanted looking buildings; smelly; stairs to Bridge Street unsafe; shadowed areas due to tall buildings; narrow pavements; not much plant life / green areas; too many pubs and bars; signage faded or dirty; lack of rubbish bins.


Summary of Opportunities and Proposed Enhancements:
