CIVIC GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT 1982 CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO LATE HOUR CATERING LICENCE

- 1 In these Conditions:
 - a) "the premises" means the premises specified in the licence.
 - b) "the licenceholder" means the person named in the licence.
 - c) "the Council" means the Aberdeen City Council.
 - d) "Director of Housing and Environment" means the Director of Housing and Environment of Aberdeen City Council.
- 2. The licenceholder shall exhibit his licence on demand to any person who may note the numbers and lettering thereon.
- 3. The licenceholder shall be permitted to trade in or from the above premises, and no other premises, in terms of this licence.
- The licenceholder shall not supply food outwith permitted hours, regardless of whether they have been ordered or paid for within these hours.
- 5. The licenceholder shall ensure that no patrons are permitted to remain on the premises at the conclusion of permitted hours.
- 6. The licenceholder shall take reasonable steps to ensure, that persons refrain from loitering in the immediate vicinity of the premises.
- 7. The licenceholder shall ensure that no amplified music or sounds of any description are emitted from the premises in such a manner as to be audible to persons outwith the premises.
- 8. The licenceholder shall ensure that an adequate number of receptacles are provided at all times for the deposit of litter by patrons of the premises, that said receptacles are emptied regularly and that the pavements in the immediate vicinity of the above are kept clear of litter.
- 9. If the premises are licensed under the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 ("the 2005 Act") to sell or supply alcoholic liquor, the licence holder shall close the premises to the public for a period of at least half an hour immediately following the termination hour or any extended hours granted under the 2005 Act, and shall, before re-opening to the public, remove, disable or conceal all apparatus, equipment and utensils used solely for the sale or supply of alcoholic liquor therefrom in order to make it clear to the public that alcoholic liquor is no longer being sold or supplied on the premises.
- 10. The beginning or ending of British Summer Time is to be disregarded for the purpose of determining the time at which the period of licensed hours ends and, accordingly, the period ends at the time it would have ended had British Summer Time not begun or ended.
