Officers below Head of Service level named within the attached documents would not expect ACC to release this information about them into the public domain under the EIRs (or the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOISA)).

Aberdeen City Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following order:-

1. This order may be cited as "The Aberdeen City Council (Albyn Lane, Aberdeen) (20mph Speed Limits) Order 2003" and shall come into operation on $28^{\text {th }}$ April, 2003.
2. No person shall drive, or cause or permit to be driven, any vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 mph on any of the following roads, namely:- Albyn Lane between Alford Lane and Union Grove, Aberdeen.

## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

## THE ABERDEEN CITY COUNCIL (AREA 2) (QUEENS CROSS / ROSEMOUNT / MID STOCKET / ASHLEY AREA, ABERDEEN) (TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT) ORDER, 2010


#### Abstract

Aberdeen City Council, in exercise of its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "The 1984 Act"), and in exercise of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Grampian Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, and having complied with the requirements of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 2002, hereby makes the following order:-


## Citation

(1) This order may be cited as "The Aberdeen City Council (Area 2) (Queens Cross / Rosemount / Mid Stocket / Ashley Area, Aberdeen) (Traffic Management) Order 2010" and shall come into operation on 27 September 2010.

## Prohibitions of Waiting

(2) Save as provided in Articles 4, 5 and 6 of this order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of road specified in the third schedule hereto at any time on any day.
(3) Save as provided in Articles 4,5 and 6 of this order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of road specified in the fourth schedule hereto between 8.00 am and 6.00 pm on any day except Saturdays and Sundays, or on any of the lengths of road specified in the fifth schedule hereto between 8.00am and 6.00pm on any day except Sundays.

## Exemptions Relating to Articles 2 and 3 Above

(4) Nothing in Article 2 or 3 of this order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of road referred to in those articles for so long as may be necessary:
(1) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load thereon or unload therefrom goods or personal luggage;
(2) when the person in control of the vehicle is:
(i) required by law to stop; or
(ii) obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident; or
(iii) prevented from proceeding by any circumstances beyond their control, where the said circumstances relate directly to the movement or otherwise of traffic on the road;
(3) if the vehicle is in material use in connection with a funeral undertaking;
(4) If the vehicle is in the service of, or is being employed by, a security company and is in actual use while currency or other valuables:
(i) are being unloaded from the vehicle; or
(ii) having been unloaded from the vehicle, are being delivered; or
(iii) are being collected from premises adjacent to that road for loading onto the vehicle; or
(iv) having been collected from such premises, are being loaded onto the vehicle.
(5) Nothing in Article 2 or 3 of this order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in those articles for so long a may be necessary:
(1) to enable a vehicle in actual use or materially necessary for such purpose (provided that the vehicle cannot conveniently be used for the same purpose in any other road) to be used in or adjacent to that road in connection with any:
(i) building operation;
(ii) demolition;
(iii) laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any electronic communications apparatus; or
(iv) excavation,
provided that, in the case of any of the operations described in subparagraphs (iii) and (iv) above, the said operation or operations are to be conducted within the extents of the road.
(2) to enable a vehicle in actual use or materially necessary for such purpose (provided that the vehicle cannot conveniently be used for the same purpose in any other road) to be used in connection with the:
(i) cleansing or lighting of any road;
(ii) removal of any obstruction to traffic on any road;
(iii) maintenance or improvement or reconstruction of any road; or
(iv) placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign or parking meter on any road.
(3) if the vehicle, being a liveried vehicle, is in the service of, or is being employed by, a universal service provider, and is in actual use while postal packets:
(i) addressed to premises adjacent to that road are being unloaded from the vehicle;
(ii) addressed to premises adjacent to that road and having been unloaded from the vehicle, are being delivered;
(iii) are being collected from postal boxes or premises adjacent to that road for loading onto the vehicle; or
(iv) having been so collected, are then being loaded onto the vehicle.
(6) Nothing in Article 2 or 3 of this order shall apply to any invalid carriage or disabled person's vehicle which is not causing an obstruction and which displays in the relevant position a valid disabled person's badge issued by a local authority.

## Definitions in relation to subsequent Articles

In the following Articles hereto, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-
"the Act" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended
"order" means The Aberdeen City Council ((1) Rosemount / Queen's Cross Area - General Traffic Management; (2) Rosemount Place / Skene Square / Gilcomston Steps / Woolmanhill / Skene Street / Esslemont Avenue Area "Pay And Display") Order 2010
"driver", in relation to a vehicle left on any length of road affected by this order, means the person authorised by the owner to drive the vehicle, and, for the avoidance of doubt, includes its owner
"owner" means the registered keeper of the vehicle at the appropriate time
"length of road", where referred to in relation to the first and second schedules hereto, means the section of carriageway adjacent to the kerb on the stated side of that length of road, which section shall be marked out and signed as a parking place in terms of section 50 of the 1984 Act to accommodate the parking of passenger or light goods vehicles (and may or may not be divided into individualised parking spaces for single vehicles)
"residential parking bay" means one of the lengths of road specified in the first schedule hereto, a parking place designated by this order and provided (subject to the limits of its markings) for the leaving of vehicles in accordance with the provisions of Articles 9, 10 and 11 hereto; if the first schedule indicates that no such lengths of road are so specified, no residential parking bays shall be available under this order
"public parking bay" means one of the lengths of road specified in the second schedule hereto, a parking place designated by this order and provided (subject to the limits of its markings) for the leaving of vehicles in accordance with the provisions of Articles 12 and 13 hereto
"the limits of its markings", as the expression is used in this order, means the limits of a residential or public parking bay (or, if relevant, the limits of an individualised space within such a bay)
"suspended indefinitely" means, in relation to a residential or public parking bay, the suspension of all or part of that bay (by authority of the proper officer of the Council) on the grounds that its use in terms of this order would cause access to a driveway or garage to be obstructed
"penalty charge" means the charge payable in respect of all contraventions of this order
"parking attendant" means a person authorised by, or on behalf of, the Council to supervise parking bays and issue penalty charge notices
"address" means a household identified in the Register of Electors or the Council Tax Valuation List (or any successor of either) as an individual residential property unit identifiable as an individualised postal address in itself, and, on any account, does not mean a residential unit that is not independently habitable, or a residential unit in a nursing home or care home, or suchlike
"vehicle" means a passenger vehicle or light goods vehicle
"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than eight passengers exclusive of the driver; the expression "passenger vehicle" includes a motorcycle as defined in the Act and excludes any caravan or trailer in any circumstances
"light goods vehicle" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description, weighing not more than 3.5 tonnes unladen and not drawing a trailer, and, on any account, excludes a trailer in any circumstances; also, this definition shall be open to the reasonable interpretation of the appropriate officer of the Council from the point of view of judging whether the general meaning and purpose of this order can be taken to embrace the use of a residential or public parking bay by a light goods vehicle in any individual case (regardless of its unladen weight)
"business" means a legitimate trading or commercial activity being carried out at premises in respect of which business rates are paid in the name of a company or partnership, and the meaning of "business" shall at all times be open to the reasonable interpretation of the appropriate officer of the Council from the point of view of judging whether the general meaning and purpose of this order can be taken to embrace in any individual case an application to hold a business permit under Article 20(4) and (5) hereto
"residential exemption permit" means the permit described in Article 20 hereto; if the holder of a non-vehicle-specific permit reports its accidental loss to the appropriate officer of the Council, that officer shall arrange for its replacement at a cost proportionate to the period for which it would otherwise have remained valid (in relation to its original year-long applicability), but, if it is reported accidentally lost on a second occasion or more, it shall be replaced only at full cost, unless clear extenuating circumstances can be held out. A vehicle-specific permit shall always be replaced at proportionate cost
"business address" means the postal address of business premises
"business premises" means any individual property unit not identifiable as a residential property, being premises (in respect of which business rates are paid) which the proper officer of the Council is satisfied can be understood as a place at which legitimate trading or business is carried out by a person seeking application for the business permit mentioned in Article 20(4) and (5) hereto

Insofar as this order may not provide explicit definition of any term, that term shall be interpreted in accordance with any definition of it in the Act, or otherwise according to the context of the order in general.

## Residential Parking Bays

During the charging hours, which shall be from 8.00am to 8.00 pm on any day except Saturdays and Sundays, any length of road in Aberdeen specified in the first schedule to this order shall operate as a residential parking bay, to be used for parking only subject to the provisions of this order, except where, within the limits of its markings as such a bay, an indication has been given that part of the bay has been suspended indefinitely by the proper officer of the Council, this to be indicated for the purposes of this order by the establishment on that part of the bay of the white line shown in diagram 1026.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.

Insofar as a vehicle is parked during the charging hours on a length of road specified in the first schedule hereto, that vehicle must be left within the limits of its markings as a residential parking bay, and the driver thereof shall exhibit a residential exemption permit on that vehicle.
(11) A residential parking bay shall be used, subject to the provisions of this order, only for the leaving of such vehicles as are able to be parked so as to stand in such a way that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the bay, and also, if relevant, within the limits of individualised designated spaces within the limits of the bay, if such individualised spaces have been established within the marked space.

## Public Parking Bays ("Pay and Display")

(1) During the charging hours, which shall be from 8.00 am to 8.00 pm on any day except Saturdays and Sundays, each of the lengths of road in Aberdeen specified in the second schedule to this order may be used for parking only subject to the provisions of this order, except where, within the limits of its markings of such a bay, an indication has been given that part of the bay has been suspended indefinitely by the proper officer of the Council, this to be indicated for the purposes of this order by the establishment on that part of the bay of the white line shown in diagram 1026.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
(2) Insofar as a vehicle is parked during the charging hours on one of the lengths of road specified in the second schedule hereto, that vehicle must be left in the limits of its markings as a public parking bay, and the driver thereof shall pay a charge in respect of the parking of the vehicle as provided for in Article 13 below, or else the driver shall display a residential exemption permit as defined in Article 20 hereto.
(3) A public parking bay shall be used, subject to the provisions of this order, only for the leaving of such vehicles as are able to be parked so as to stand in such a way that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the bay, and also, if relevant, within the limits of individualised designated spaces within the limits of the bay, if such individualised designated spaces have been established within the marked space.

## Charges

(1) The charge required to be paid in respect of a vehicle left in one of the lengths of road specified in the second schedule to this order shall be 35 p for 30 minutes, 75 p for one hour, $£ 1.50$ for two hours, and $£ 2.30$ for a (maximum) period of three hours.
(2) The driver having left the vehicle during the charging hours in one of the lengths of road specified in the second schedule to this order, the relevant charge shall then be payable by the insertion, in a ticket issuing machine relating to that parking bay, of a combination of coins of the denominations indicated on that ticket issuing machine such that their total value - the fee paid - is equal to or exceeds the relevant charge.
(1) After insertion of the fee paid, the driver of the vehicle shall exhibit the ticket issued by the ticket-issuing machine in accordance with the provisions of this Article. No other ticket issued by a ticket-issuing machine shall be exhibited on the vehicle.
(2) The ticket referred to in this article, or the permit referred to in Article 20 hereto, shall (whenever exhibited on a vehicle) be exhibited in a conspicuous position facing forward on the near side of the vehicle behind the glass of the windscreen so that all of the front of the said ticket is clearly visible to a person standing at the near side of the vehicle.

## (15) Restriction on Removal of Tickets and Notices

When a ticket has been exhibited on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this order, no person shall transfer such ticket for use on another vehicle.
(16) Where a penalty charge notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this order, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle or a parking attendant, shall remove the notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.
(17) Ticket Issuing Machine to be Installed near Parking Bays

There shall be at least one ticket issuing machine within reasonable walking distance of each public parking bay in respect of which charging is applicable.
(18) Indications by Tickets Issued
(1) Payment of the charge required (by Article 13 hereto) for a vehicle left in a parking bay shall be indicated by the issue and subsequent exhibition of the ticket referred to in Article 14 of this order.
(2) The expiry of the period for which the charge was required shall be presumed (i) if there is exhibited on the vehicle a ticket, issued by a ticket issuing machine relating to the public parking bay in which the vehicle is left, showing the time of expiry of that period and (ii) if the
time shown on the clock on the machine is later than the time shown on the ticket.

If, at any time when a vehicle is left in a public parking bay during the charging hours, neither a residential permit nor a business permit nor the ticket referred to in Article 14 hereto is exhibited on that vehicle, it shall be presumed (unless the contrary is proved) that the relevant charge was payable but has not been paid.

## Residential Exemption Permits

(1) Any resident, whose usual place of abode is at premises the address of which is in any street listed in the second schedule hereto, shall be eligible to hold a residential exemption permit at an annual cost of $£ 80$ (for a first permit) or $£ 120$ (for a second permit), which, when displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of his or her vehicle, will allow the vehicle to be left in any residential parking bay, and, also, suspend the need to buy and display an appropriate ticket before making use of any public parking bay, on condition that the bay has been established by virtue of this order, and, in terms of this paragraph, no more than two permits shall be issued in respect of a single address, one of which permits is bound to have the registration number of a single identifiable vehicle entered on it whereas the other may be issued without such vehicle-specificity if the applicant requests this an applicant who wishes to hold only a single permit may hold a permit of either type - but, where a permit is issued without the registration number of a single identifiable vehicle entered on it, this will be on the strict understanding that the permit is intended for the parking convenience of the resident who has applied for it (including his or her visitors), and on the strict understanding that the permit should not be alienated or disposed of in such a way that the applicant does not still literally or essentially have it in his or her keeping. In particular, a permit must not be sold. If the original applicant, or a resident at the address in question, can no longer produce the permit upon request, it shall be presumed in terms of this order that the permit is no longer held by a resident whose usual place of abode is at premises the address of which is in one of the streets listed above, and, accordingly, any such permit shall no longer have the effect described herein.
(2) The appropriate officer of the Council shall require sight of any suitable documentation in connection with the need to determine whether or not an applicant to hold a residential exemption permit is eligible to do so.
(3) Any person eligible to hold a residential exemption permit in accordance with this Article shall also be eligible to obtain, from the appropriate officer of the Council, a concessionary ticket to allow any visitor to his or her address to park a passenger vehicle in any parking bay established by this order; one of these tickets, when displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of the visitor's vehicle, will suspend the provisions of this order in regard to the parking of that vehicle, but only in respect of the need to buy and display the ticket referred to in Article 14 hereto, (or a residential, business or contractors' permit) before making use of a residential or public parking
bay established by virtue of this order but, in terms of this subparagraph, no resident eligible to hold a residential exemption permit shall be eligible to obtain more than a maximum yearly allocation of 15 such concessionary tickets for visitors' parking, and the cost of obtaining any one concessionary ticket (up to the aforementioned yearly maximum of 15 ) shall be $50 \%$ of the cost of the current highest rate for one day's off-street parking in an off-street car park operated by the City Council, and no such ticket shall be held by a resident eligible to hold a residential exemption permit if more than 15 such tickets have already been issued in respect of his or her individual address, and, otherwise, such tickets shall only be issued in respect of any individual address to the extent that the maximum number of 15 tickets has not been taken up in respect of that address as a result of earlier applications in the relevant operational year.
(4) Any person who is not a resident eligible to hold a residential permit in terms of this Article, but who is engaged in registered trade at premises the address of which would otherwise have attracted eligibility to hold such a permit, shall by virtue of this Article be eligible to hold one or two permits of a special type (associated in each case with a single identifiable vehicle of which the respective permit holder is owner or keeper) issued in relation to any shop or business the premises of which are located in one of the lengths of road specified in that paragraph, being a shop or business which the applicant can demonstrate satisfactorily that he or she represents.
(5) Any person eligible to hold a permit in terms of the foregoing paragraph - i.e. not a resident but be a person representing a business situated at an address which would otherwise be a qualifying address from the point of view of residential eligibility - shall be eligible to hold a permit only on behalf of the business which he or she represents, and that business shall be obliged to pay an annual cost of $£ 160$ for such a permit, and this permit shall be issued in respect of a single identifiable vehicle the registration number of which shall be inscribed on the permit, and no more than two such permits shall be held by any one shop or business.

## (21) Exemptions from Parking Charges and Time Limits

(1) If, at the time when a vehicle is left during the charging hours in a public parking bay defined in the second schedule hereto, there are on all of the ticket issuing machines relating to that parking bay notices placed by any person duly authorised by the Council indicating that the ticket issuing machines are out of order, that vehicle shall be exempt from the initial charge, provided that it is removed prior to the commencement of the next period of charging hours after the first of the ticket issuing machines relating to that marked parking bay has been rectified. If the vehicle is not removed before that period, the initial charge shall be treated as having been incurred at the time that the first of the ticket issuing machines relating to that parking bay was rectified, and the provisions of the order shall apply accordingly.
(2) An invalid carriage, or a disabled person's vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge issued by a local authority, shall be exempt from payment of any charge, or from compliance with any limitation of time during which a vehicle may be left in a marked parking bay, and, also, for the purposes of a residential parking bay, shall be treated as it if were displaying a residential exemption permit.
(3) Any vehicle of the type specified hereinunder may wait anywhere on a length of carriageway specified in the first and second schedules to this order; namely:-
(a) vehicles being used for fire and rescue, ambulance or police force purposes; or
(b) vehicles, not being passenger vehicles, being used in the service of the local roads authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties, provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or duties or the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait at that location.

## Movement of Vehicles in Parking Bays in Emergencies

Where necessary and reasonable, a police constable in uniform, or any person duly authorised by the Council, may move (or cause to be moved) any vehicle left in a parking bay.

## Power to Suspend Use of Parking Bays

(1) Any person duly authorised in that behalf by the Council may suspend the use of a parking bay whenever and for such period as he or she may consider necessary and reasonable.
(2) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any part of a parking bay during such period as there is, in or adjacent to that part of the bay, a sign in pursuance of the immediately preceding subparagraph.

## Contractors' Permits

(1) Any contractor who believes that he or she (or his or her firm or company) is likely to be engaged commercially upon building or servicing works at premises adjacent to any length of road specified in either of the first two schedules hereto may be eligible to hold a contractors' permit at a cost of $£ 50$ a month, or $£ 550$ a year. Such a ticket, when held properly in accordance with this Article and displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of that contractor's vehicle during such building or servicing works as attracted eligibility to hold the permit, will suspend the provisions of this order in regard to the parking of that vehicle at that time, in respect of any need to display a permit or ticket in accordance with Articles 9-21 hereto and, also, this permit shall have the equivalent effect in respect of any other traffic regulation order made by Aberdeen City Council (or an antecedent or
successor authority) providing for public or residential parking bays equivalent to those provided for by this order.
(2) No person shall be eligible to hold a contractors' permit unless the appropriate officer of the Council is satisfied that the commercial activity in respect of which application is being made is able to be characterised directly in terms of one of the following trading categories -

- Aerial installation
- Bathroom fitting
- Building
- Carpentry
- Carpet fitting
- Painting and decorating
- Insulation installation
- Electrical installation and gas maintenance
- Joinery
- Kitchen fitting
- Masonry
- Painting
- Plumbing
- Roofing
- Tiling
- Window fitting
- and that that activity is one which it would be unreasonable to expect be conducted without the contractor's vehicle being directly outside the property at which the work is being carried out, and, in particular, there shall be no eligibility where the proximity of the contractor's vehicle is merely a matter of convenience.
(3) Any question of eligibility may be tested retrospectively if the proper officer of the Council has cause to believe that a contractor's permit has been obtained legitimately in terms of the information held out by the applicant to the Council but has subsequently been used for parking a vehicle in circumstances outwith the requirements of the foregoing paragraph, and the Council shall have the right to withdraw or invalidate a contractor's permit if the proper officer of the Council is satisfied it has been knowingly misused in this way.


## Other Traffic Regulations

(25) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to stop on any of the lengths of road specified in the sixth schedule hereto, between 8.00am and 5.00 pm on any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday, these lengths of road being in each case adjacent to a school entrance and being marked accordingly in pursuance of this order and in terms of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
(26) No person shall drive, or cause or permit to be driven, any vehicle on any of the lengths of road referred to in column one of the seventh schedule to this order, other than in the direction specified directly opposite that reference in column two of that schedule.
(27) No person shall drive, or cause or permit to be driven, any vehicle (one) on Forbes Street, Aberdeen, so as to turn right into Rosemount Terrace or (two) on Westburn Road, so as to turn right into Argyll Place, except (only in this case of turning from Westburn Road into Argyll Place) for any fire, ambulance
or police vehicle being driven by its authorised driver in the circumstances of emergency.
(28) Save as provided for in Articles 29 and 30 hereto, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any day except Sundays on (one) the north side of Rosemount Place from Argyll Place eastwards for 57 metres or thereby, (two) the south side of Rosemount Place from Westfield Road eastwards to Craigie Loanings, and (three) both sides of Westfield Road for its entire length.
(29) Nothing in Article 28 hereto shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of road referred to in that article for so as long as may be necessary to:-
(a) enable any person to board or alight from the vehicle; or
(b) enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle, except that this exemption shall not apply between 7.30am and 9.30am in respect of Rosemount Place; shall not apply between 8.00am and 9.30 am in respect of Westfield Road; and shall not apply between 4.00 pm and 6.00 pm in respect of each of these roads.
(30) Nothing in Article 28 hereto shall apply to any disabled person's vehicle which is not causing an obstruction which displays in the relevant position a valid disabled person's badge issued by a local authority, except that this exemption shall not apply between 7.30am and 9.30am in respect of Rosemount Place; shall not apply between 8.00am and 9.30am in respect of Westfield Road; and shall not apply between 4.00 pm and 6.00 pm in respect of both of these roads.

## ABERDEEN CITY COUNCIL

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984

## THE ABERDEEN CITY COUNCIL (FERRYHILL/HOLBURN/BROOMHILL/RUTHRIESTON AREA, ABERDEEN) (AREA V) (TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT) ORDER 2011

Aberdeen City Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following order:-

## (1) Citation

This order may be cited as "The Aberdeen City Council (Ferryhill/Holburn/ Broomhill/Ruthrieston Area, Aberdeen) (Area V) (Traffic Management) Order, 2011" and shall come into operation on 24 February 2011.

## Prohibitions of Waiting

(2) Save as provided in Articles 4, 5 and 6 of this order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of road specified in the third schedule hereto at any time on any day.
(3) Save as provided in Articles 4, 5 and 6 of this order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of road specified in the fourth schedule hereto between 8.00 am and 6.00 pm on any day, or on any of the lengths of road specified in the fifth schedule hereto for longer than forty-five minutes on any day (except Sundays) and, where a vehicle has been so left and then driven away before the expiry of the forty-five minute limit, no person shall cause or permit that vehicle to wait for a second time on any of those lengths of road until a period of at least fifteen minutes has elapsed since departing

## Exemptions Relating to Articles 2 and 3 Above

(4) Nothing in Article 2 or 3 of this order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of road referred to in those articles for so long as may be necessary:
(1) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load thereon or unload therefrom goods or personal luggage;
(2) when the person in control of the vehicle is:
(i) required by law to stop; or
(ii) obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident; or
(iii) prevented from proceeding by any circumstances beyond their control, where the said circumstances relate directly to the movement or otherwise of traffic on the road;
(3) if the vehicle is in material use in connection with a funeral undertaking;
(4) If the vehicle is in the service of, or is being employed by, a security company and is in actual use while currency or other valuables:
(i) are being unloaded from the vehicle; or
(ii) having been unloaded from the vehicle, are being delivered; or
(iii) are being collected from premises adjacent to that road for loading onto the vehicle; or
(iv) having been collected from such premises, are being loaded onto the vehicle.
(5) Nothing in Article 2 or 3 of this order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in those articles for so long a may be necessary:
(1) to enable a vehicle in actual use or materially necessary for such purpose (provided that the vehicle cannot conveniently be used for the same purpose in any other road) to be used in or adjacent to that road in connection with any:
(i) building operation;
(ii) demolition;
(iii) laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any electronic communications apparatus; or
(iv) excavation,
provided that, in the case of any of the operations described in subparagraphs (iii) and (iv) above, the said operation or operations are to be conducted within the extents of the road.
(2) to enable a vehicle in actual use or materially necessary for such purpose (provided that the vehicle cannot conveniently be used for the same purpose in any other road) to be used in connection with the:
(i) cleansing or lighting of any road;
(ii) removal of any obstruction to traffic on any road;
(iii) maintenance or improvement or reconstruction of any road; or
(iv) placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign or parking meter on any road.
(3) if the vehicle, being a liveried vehicle, is in the service of, or is being employed by, a universal service provider, and is in actual use while postal packets:
(i) addressed to premises adjacent to that road are being unloaded from the vehicle;
(ii) addressed to premises adjacent to that road and having been unloaded from the vehicle, are being delivered;
(iii) are being collected from postal boxes or premises adjacent to that road for loading onto the vehicle; or
(iv) having been so collected, are then being loaded onto the vehicle.
(6) Nothing in Article 2 or 3 of this order shall apply to any invalid carriage or disabled person's vehicle which is not causing an obstruction and which displays in the relevant position a valid disabled person's badge issued by a local authority.

## (7) Definitions in relation to subsequent Articles

In the following Articles hereto, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them.
"the Act" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended
"order" means The Aberdeen City Council (Ferryhill/Holburn/Broomhill/ Ruthrieston Area, Aberdeen) (Area V) (Traffic Management) Order, 2011
"driver", in relation to a vehicle left on any length of road affected by this order, means the person authorised by the owner to drive the vehicle, and, for the avoidance of doubt, includes its owner
"owner" means the registered keeper of the vehicle at the appropriate time
"length of road", where referred to in relation to the first and second schedules hereto, means the section of carriageway adjacent to the kerb on the stated side of that length of road, which section shall be marked out and signed as a parking place in terms of section 50 of the 1984 Act to accommodate the parking of passenger or light goods vehicles (and may or may not be divided into individualised parking spaces for single vehicles)
"residential parking bay" means one of the lengths of road specified in the first schedule hereto, a parking place designated by this order and provided (subject to the limits of its markings) for the leaving of vehicles in accordance with the provisions of Articles 9, 10 and 11 hereto; if the first schedule indicates that no such lengths of road are so specified, no residential parking bays shall be available under this order
"public parking bay" means one of the lengths of road specified in the second schedule hereto, a parking place designated by this order and provided (subject to the limits of its markings) for the leaving of vehicles in accordance with the provisions of Articles 12 and 13 hereto
"the limits of its markings", as the expression is used in this order, means the limits of a residential or public parking bay (or, if relevant, the limits of an individualised space within such a bay)
"suspended indefinitely" means, in relation to a residential or public parking bay, the suspension of all or part of that bay (by authority of the proper officer of the Council) on the grounds that its use in terms of this order would cause access to a driveway or garage to be obstructed
"maximum period of stay" means a maximum period of uninterrupted parking
"penalty charge" means the charge payable in respect of all contraventions of this order
"parking attendant" means a person authorised by, or on behalf of, the Council to supervise parking bays and issue penalty charge notices
"address" means a household identified in the Register of Electors or the Council Tax Valuation List (or any successor of either) as an individual residential property unit identifiable as an individualised postal address in itself, and, on any account, does not mean a residential unit that is not independently habitable, or a residential unit in a nursing home or care home, or suchlike
"vehicle" means a passenger vehicle or light goods vehicle
"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than eight passengers exclusive of the driver; the expression "passenger vehicle" includes a motorcycle as defined in the Act and excludes any caravan or trailer in any circumstances
"light goods vehicle" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description, weighing not more than 3.5 tonnes unladen and not drawing a trailer, and, on any account, excludes a trailer in any circumstances; also, this definition shall be open to the reasonable interpretation of the appropriate officer of the Council from the point of view of judging whether the general meaning and purpose of this order can be taken to embrace the use of a residential or public parking bay by a light goods vehicle in any individual case (regardless of its unladen weight)
"business" means a legitimate trading or commercial activity being carried out at premises in respect of which business rates are paid in the name of a company or partnership, and the meaning of "business" shall at all times be open to the reasonable interpretation of the appropriate officer of the Council from the point of view of judging whether the general meaning and purpose of this order can be taken to embrace in any individual case an application to hold a business permit under Article 20(4) and (5) hereto
"residential exemption permit" means the permit described in Article 20 hereto; if the holder of a non-vehicle-specific permit reports its accidental loss to the appropriate officer of the Council, that officer shall arrange for its replacement at a cost proportionate to the period for which it would otherwise have remained valid (in relation to its original year-long applicability), but, if it is reported accidentally lost on a second occasion or more, it shall be replaced only at full cost, unless clear extenuating circumstances can be held out. A vehicle-specific permit shall always be replaced at proportionate cost
"business address" means the postal address of business premises
"business premises" means any individual property unit not identifiable as a residential property, being premises (in respect of which business rates are paid) which the proper officer of the Council is satisfied can be understood as a place at which legitimate trading or business is carried out by a person seeking application for the business permit mentioned in Article 20(4) and (5) hereto
(8) Insofar as this order may not provide explicit definition of any term, that term shall be interpreted in accordance with any definition of it in the Act, or otherwise according to the context of the order in general.

## (9) Residential Parking Bays

During the charging hours, which shall be from 8.00 am to 8.00 pm on any day (except Sundays) any length of road in Aberdeen specified in the first schedule to this order shall operate as a residential parking bay, to be used for parking only subject to the provisions of this order, except where, within the limits of its markings as such a bay, an indication has been given that part of the bay has been suspended indefinitely by the proper officer of the Council, this to be indicated for the purposes of this order by the establishment on that part of the bay of the white line shown in diagram 1026.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
(10) Insofar as a vehicle is parked during the charging hours on a length of road specified in the first schedule hereto, that vehicle must be left within the limits of its markings as a residential parking bay, and the driver thereof shall exhibit a residential exemption permit on that vehicle.
(11) A residential parking bay shall be used, subject to the provisions of this order, only for the leaving of such vehicles as are able to be parked so as to stand in such a way that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the bay, and also, if relevant, within the limits of individualised designated spaces within the limits of the bay, if such individualised spaces have been established within the marked space.

## (12) Public Parking Bays ("Pay and Display")

(1) During the charging hours, which shall be from 8.00 am to 8.00 pm on any day (except Sundays) each of the lengths of road in Aberdeen specified in the second schedule to this order may be used for parking only subject to the provisions of this order, except where, within the limits of its markings as such a bay, an indication has been given that part of the bay has been suspended indefinitely by the proper officer of the Council, this to be indicated for the purposes of this order by the establishment on that part of the bay of the white line shown in diagram 1026.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
(2) Insofar as a vehicle is parked during the charging hours on one of the lengths of road specified in the second schedule hereto, that vehicle must be left in the limits of its markings as a public parking bay, and the driver thereof shall pay a charge in respect of the parking of the vehicle as provided for in Article 13 below, or else the driver shall display a residential exemption permit as defined in Article 20 hereto.
(3) A public parking bay shall be used, subject to the provisions of this order, only for the leaving of such vehicles as are able to be parked so as to stand in such a way that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the bay, and also, if relevant, within the limits of individualised designated spaces within the limits of the bay, if such individualised designated spaces have been established within the marked space.

## Charges

(1) The charge required to be paid in respect of a vehicle left in one of the lengths of road specified in the second schedule to this order shall be $£ 0.35$ for 30 minutes, $£ 0.75$ for one hour, $£ 1.50$ for two hours, or $£ 2.30$ for a (maximum) period of three hours.
(2) The driver having left the vehicle during the charging hours in one of the lengths of road specified in the second schedule to this order, the relevant charge shall then be payable by the insertion, in a ticket issuing machine relating to that parking bay, of a combination of coins of the denominations indicated on that ticket issuing machine such that their total value - the fee paid - is equal to or exceeds the relevant charge.

After insertion of the fee paid, the driver of the vehicle shall exhibit the ticket issued by the ticket-issuing machine in accordance with the provisions of this Article. No other ticket issued by a ticket-issuing machine shall be exhibited on the vehicle.
(2) The ticket referred to in this article, or the permit referred to in Article 20 hereto, shall (whenever exhibited on a vehicle) be exhibited in a conspicuous position facing forward on the near side of the vehicle behind the glass of the windscreen so that all of the front of the said ticket is clearly visible to a person standing at the near side of the vehicle.
(15) Restriction on Removal of Tickets and Notices

When a ticket has been exhibited on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this order, no person shall transfer such ticket for use on another vehicle.
(16) Where a penalty charge notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this order, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle or a parking attendant, shall remove the notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.
(17) Ticket Issuing Machine to be Installed near Parking Bays

There shall be at least one ticket issuing machine within reasonable walking distance of each public parking bay in respect of which charging is applicable.

Indications by Tickets Issued
(1) Payment of the charge required (by Article 13 hereto) for a vehicle left in a parking bay shall be indicated by the issue and subsequent exhibition of the ticket referred to in Article 14 of this order.
(2) The expiry of the period for which the charge was required shall be presumed (i) if there is exhibited on the vehicle a ticket, issued by a ticket issuing machine relating to the public parking bay in which the vehicle is left, showing the time of expiry of that period and (ii) if the time shown on the clock on the machine is later than the time shown on the ticket.
(19) If, at any time when a vehicle is left in a public parking bay during the charging hours, neither a residential permit nor a business permit nor the ticket referred to in Article 14 hereto is exhibited on that vehicle, it shall be presumed (unless the contrary is proved) that the relevant charge was payable but has not been paid.

## Residential Exemption Permits

(1) Any resident, whose usual place of abode is at premises the address of which is in any street specified in the eighth schedule hereto shall be eligible to hold a residential exemption permit at an annual cost of $£ 80$ (for a first permit) or $£ 120$ (for a second permit), which, when displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of his or her vehicle, will allow the vehicle to be left in any residential parking bay, and, also, suspend the need to buy and display an appropriate ticket before making use of any public parking bay, on condition that the bay has been established by virtue of this order, and, in terms of this paragraph, no more than two permits shall be issued in respect of a single address, one of which permits is bound to have the registration number of a single identifiable vehicle entered on it whereas the other may be issued without such vehicle-specificity if the applicant requests this - an applicant who wishes to hold only a single permit may hold a permit of either type - but, where a permit is issued without the registration number of a single identifiable vehicle entered on it, this will be on the strict understanding that the permit is intended for the parking convenience of the resident who has applied for it (including his or her visitors), and on the strict understanding that the permit should not be alienated or disposed of in such a way that the applicant does not still literally or essentially have it in his or her keeping. In particular, a permit must not be sold. If the original applicant, or a resident at the address in question, can no longer produce the permit upon request, it shall be presumed in terms of this order that the permit is no longer held by a resident whose usual place of abode is at premises the address of which is in one of the streets listed above, and, accordingly, any such permit shall no longer have the effect described herein.
(2) The appropriate officer of the Council shall require sight of any suitable documentation in connection with the need to determine whether or not an applicant to hold a residential exemption permit is eligible to do so.
(3) Any person eligible to hold a residential exemption permit in accordance with this Article shall also be eligible to obtain, from the appropriate officer of the Council, a concessionary ticket to allow any visitor to his or her address to park a passenger vehicle in any parking bay established by this order; one of these tickets, when displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of the visitor's vehicle, will suspend the provisions of this order in regard to the parking of that vehicle, but only in respect of the need to buy and display the ticket referred to in Article 14 hereto, (or a residential, business or contractors' permit) before making use of a residential or public parking bay established by virtue of this order but, in terms of this sub-paragraph, no resident eligible to hold a residential exemption permit shall be eligible to obtain more than a maximum yearly allocation of 15 such concessionary tickets for visitors' parking, and the
cost of obtaining any one concessionary ticket (up to the aforementioned yearly maximum of 15 ) shall be $50 \%$ of the cost of the current highest rate for one day's off-street parking in an off-street car park operated by the City Council, and no such ticket shall be held by a resident eligible to hold a residential exemption permit if more than 15 such tickets have already been issued in respect of his or her individual address, and, otherwise, such tickets shall only be issued in respect of any individual address to the extent that the maximum number of 15 tickets has not been taken up in respect of that address as a result of earlier applications in the relevant operational year.
(4) Any person who is not a resident eligible to hold a residential permit in terms of this Article, but who is engaged in registered trade at premises the address of which would otherwise have attracted eligibility to hold such a permit, shall by virtue of this Article be eligible to hold one or two permits of a special type (associated in each case with a single identifiable vehicle of which the respective permit holder is owner or keeper) issued in relation to any shop or business the premises of which are located in one of the lengths of road specified in that paragraph, being a shop or business which the applicant can demonstrate satisfactorily that he or she represents.
(5) Any person eligible to hold a permit in terms of the foregoing paragraph i.e. not a resident but be a person representing a business situated at an address which would otherwise be a qualifying address from the point of view of residential eligibility - shall be eligible to hold a permit only on behalf of the business which he or she represents, and that business shall be obliged to pay an annual cost of $£ 160$ for such a permit, and this permit shall be issued in respect of a single identifiable vehicle the registration number of which shall be inscribed on the permit, and no more than two such permits shall be held by any one shop or business.

## (21) Exemptions from Parking Charges and Time Limits

(1) If, at the time when a vehicle is left during the charging hours in a public parking bay defined in the second schedule hereto, there are on all of the ticket issuing machines relating to that parking bay notices placed by any person duly authorised by the Council indicating that the ticket issuing machines are out of order, that vehicle shall be exempt from the initial charge, provided that it is removed prior to the commencement of the next period of charging hours after the first of the ticket issuing machines relating to that marked parking bay has been rectified. If the vehicle is not removed before that period, the initial charge shall be treated as having been incurred at the time that the first of the ticket issuing machines relating to that parking bay was rectified, and the provisions of the order shall apply accordingly.
(2) An invalid carriage, or a disabled person's vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge issued by a local authority, shall be exempt from payment of any charge, or from compliance with any limitation of time during which a vehicle may be left in a marked parking bay, and, also, for the purposes
of a residential parking bay, shall be treated as it if were displaying a residential exemption permit.
(3) Any vehicle of the type specified hereinunder may wait anywhere on a length of carriageway specified in the first and second schedules to this order; namely:-
(a) vehicles being used for fire and rescue, ambulance or police force purposes; or
(b) vehicles, not being passenger vehicles, being used in the service of the local roads authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties, provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or duties or the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait at that location.

## (22) Movement of Vehicles in Parking Bays in Emergencies

Where necessary and reasonable, a police constable in uniform, or any person duly authorised by the Council, may move (or cause to be moved) any vehicle left in a parking bay.

## Power to Suspend Use of Parking Bays

(1) Any person duly authorised in that behalf by the Council may suspend the use of a parking bay whenever and for such period as he or she may consider necessary and reasonable.
(2) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any part of a parking bay during such period as there is, in or adjacent to that part of the bay, a sign in pursuance of the immediately preceding sub-paragraph.

## Contractors' Permits

(1) Any contractor who believes that he or she (or his or her firm or company) is likely to be engaged commercially upon building or servicing works at premises adjacent to any length of road specified in either of the first two schedules hereto may be eligible to hold a contractors' permit at a cost of $£ 50$ a month, or $£ 550$ a year. Such a ticket, when held properly in accordance with this Article and displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of that contractor's vehicle during such building or servicing works as attracted eligibility to hold the permit, will suspend the provisions of this order in regard to the parking of that vehicle at that time, in respect of any need to display a permit or ticket in accordance with Articles 9-21 hereto and, also, this permit shall have the equivalent effect in respect of any other traffic regulation order made by Aberdeen City Council (or an antecedent or successor authority) providing for public or residential parking bays equivalent to those provided for by this order.
(2) No person shall be eligible to hold a contractors' permit unless the appropriate officer of the Council is satisfied that the commercial activity in respect of which application is being made is able to be characterised
directly in terms of one of the following trading categories -

- Aerial installation
- Bathroom fitting
- Building
- Carpentry
- Carpet fitting
- Painting and decorating
- Insulation installation
- Electrical installation and gas maintenance
- Joinery
- Kitchen fitting
- Masonry
- Painting
- Plumbing
- Roofing
- Tiling
- Window fitting
- and that that activity is one which it would be unreasonable to expect be conducted without the contractor's vehicle being directly outside the property at which the work is being carried out, and, in particular, there shall be no eligibility where the proximity of the contractor's vehicle is merely a matter of convenience.
(3) Any question of eligibility may be tested retrospectively if the proper officer of the Council has cause to believe that a contractor's permit has been obtained legitimately in terms of the information held out by the applicant to the Council but has subsequently been used for parking a vehicle in circumstances outwith the requirements of the foregoing paragraph, and the Council shall have the right to withdraw or invalidate a contractor's permit if the proper officer of the Council is satisfied it has been knowingly misused in this way.
(25) Prohibitions of Loading

No person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the east side of Holburn Street, extending from its junction with Justice Mill Lane southwards to Willowbank Road, between 8.00 a.m. and 9.30 a.m., or between 4.30 p.m. and 6.00 p.m., on any day.
(26) No person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the west side of Market Street, extending from its junction with North Esplanade West northwards to Guild Street, between 7.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m., 12 noon and 2.30 p.m., or between 4.00 p.m. and 6.00 p.m., on any day.
(27) No person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the east side of Market Street, extending from a point 10 metres or thereby south of the extended south kerbline of Poynernook Road northwards to Guild Street, between 7.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m., 12 noon and 2.30 p.m., or between 4.00 p.m. and 6.00 p.m., on any day.
(28) Prohibition of U-turns

No person shall drive, or cause or permit to be driven, any vehicle on that length of South Anderson Drive extending from Broomhill Road southwards to a point 15 metres or thereby south of Ruthrieston Road, so as to carry out a $U$ turn.
(29) Prohibitions of Right Turns

No person shall drive, or cause or permit to be driven, any vehicle (1) on Bloomfield Road so as to turn right into Great Southern Road, (2) on Broomhill Avenue so as to turn right into South Anderson Drive, (3) on Great Southern Road so as to turn right into Bloomfield Road, (4) on Great Western Road so as to turn right into Holburn Street, (5) on Holburn Street so as to turn right into Willowbank Road, and (6) on Ruthrieston Road, west of South Anderson Drive, so as to turn right into South Anderson Drive, except for cyclists.
(30) One-way Regulations

No person shall drive, or cause or permit to be driven, any vehicle on any of the lengths of road referred to in the first column of the sixth schedule hereto other than in the direction specified opposite such reference in each case in the second column of that schedule.
(31) School Keep Clear Markings

No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to stop on any of the lengths of road specified in the seventh schedule hereto between 8.00 a.m. and $5.00 \mathrm{p.m}$. on any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday, these lengths of road being in each case adjacent to a school entrance and being marked accordingly in pursuance of this order and in terms of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1994.

## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

## THE ABERDEEN CITY COUNCIL (ASHLEY ZONE) (ZONE T) (CONTROLLED PARKING AND WAITING RESTRICTIONS) ORDER 2011

Aberdeen City Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following order:-

## Citation

(1) This order may be cited as "The Aberdeen City Council (Ashley Zone) (Zone T) (Controlled Parking and Waiting Restrictions) Order 2011" and shall come into operation on 24 February 2011.

## Prohibitions of Waiting

(2) Save as provided in Articles 4, 5 and 6 of this order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of road specified in the third schedule hereto at any time on any day.
(3) Save as provided in Articles 4, 5 and 6 of this order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of road specified in the fourth schedule hereto between 8.00 am and 6.00 pm on any day except Saturdays and Sundays, or on any of the lengths of road specified in the fifth schedule hereto between 8.00am and 6.00 pm on any day except Sundays.

## Exemptions Relating to Articles 2 and 3 Above

(4) Nothing in Article 2 or 3 of this order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of road referred to in those articles for so long as may be necessary:
(1) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load thereon or unload therefrom goods or personal luggage;
(2) when the person in control of the vehicle is:
(i) required by law to stop; or
(ii) obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident; or
(iii) prevented from proceeding by any circumstances beyond their control, where the said circumstances relate directly to the movement or otherwise of traffic on the road;
(3) if the vehicle is in material use in connection with a funeral undertaking;
(4) If the vehicle is in the service of, or is being employed by, a security company and is in actual use while currency or other valuables:
(i) are being unloaded from the vehicle; or
(ii) having been unloaded from the vehicle, are being delivered; or
(iii) are being collected from premises adjacent to that road for loading onto the vehicle; or
(iv) having been collected from such premises, are being loaded onto the vehicle.
(5) Nothing in Article 2 or 3 of this order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in those articles for so long a may be necessary:
(1) to enable a vehicle in actual use or materially necessary for such purpose (provided that the vehicle cannot conveniently be used for the same purpose in any other road) to be used in or adjacent to that road in connection with any:
(i) building operation;
(ii) demolition;
(iii) laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any electronic communications apparatus; or
(iv) excavation,
provided that, in the case of any of the operations described in subparagraphs (iii) and (iv) above, the said operation or operations are to be conducted within the extents of the road.
(2) to enable a vehicle in actual use or materially necessary for such purpose (provided that the vehicle cannot conveniently be used for the same purpose in any other road) to be used in connection with the:
(i) cleansing or lighting of any road;
(ii) removal of any obstruction to traffic on any road;
(iii) maintenance or improvement or reconstruction of any road; or
(iv) placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign or parking meter on any road.
(3) if the vehicle, being a liveried vehicle, is in the service of, or is being employed by, a universal service provider, and is in actual use while postal packets:
(i) addressed to premises adjacent to that road are being unloaded from the vehicle;
(ii) addressed to premises adjacent to that road and having been unloaded from the vehicle, are being delivered;
(iii) are being collected from postal boxes or premises adjacent to that road for loading onto the vehicle; or
(iv) having been so collected, are then being loaded onto the vehicle.
(6) Nothing in Article 2 or 3 of this order shall apply to any invalid carriage or disabled person's vehicle which is not causing an obstruction and which displays in the relevant position a valid disabled person's badge issued by a local authority.

## (7) Definitions in relation to subsequent Articles

In the following Articles hereto, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them.

"the Act" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended<br>"order" means The Aberdeen City Council (Ashley Zone) (Zone T) (Controlled Parking and Waiting Restrictions) Order 2011

"driver", in relation to a vehicle left on any length of road affected by this order, means the person authorised by the owner to drive the vehicle, and, for the avoidance of doubt, includes its owner
"owner" means the registered keeper of the vehicle at the appropriate time
"length of road", where referred to in relation to the first and second schedules hereto, means the section of carriageway adjacent to the kerb on the stated side of that length of road, which section shall be marked out and signed as a parking place in terms of section 50 of the 1984 Act to accommodate the parking of passenger or light goods vehicles (and may or may not be divided into individualised parking spaces for single vehicles)
"residential parking bay" means one of the lengths of road specified in the first schedule hereto, a parking place designated by this order and provided (subject to the limits of its markings) for the leaving of vehicles in accordance with the provisions of Articles 9, 10 and 11 hereto; if the first schedule indicates that no such lengths of road are so specified, no residential parking bays shall be available under this order
"public parking bay" means one of the lengths of road specified in the second schedule hereto, a parking place designated by this order and provided (subject to the limits of its markings) for the leaving of vehicles in accordance with the provisions of Articles 12 and 13 hereto
"the limits of its markings", as the expression is used in this order, means the limits of a residential or public parking bay (or, if relevant, the limits of an individualised space within such a bay)
"suspended indefinitely" means, in relation to a residential or public parking bay, the suspension of all or part of that bay (by authority of the proper officer of the Council) on the grounds that its use in terms of this order would cause access to a driveway or garage to be obstructed
"maximum period of stay" means a maximum period of uninterrupted parking
"penalty charge" means the charge payable in respect of all contraventions of this order
"parking attendant" means a person authorised by, or on behalf of, the Council to supervise parking bays and issue penalty charge notices
"address" means a household identified in the Register of Electors or the Council Tax Valuation List (or any successor of either) as an individual residential property unit identifiable as an individualised postal address in itself, and, on any account, does not mean a residential unit that is not independently habitable, or a residential unit in a nursing home or care home, or suchlike
"vehicle" means a passenger vehicle or light goods vehicle
"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than eight passengers exclusive of the driver; the expression "passenger vehicle" includes a motorcycle as defined in the Act and excludes any caravan or trailer in any circumstances
"light goods vehicle" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description, weighing not more than 3.5 tonnes unladen and not drawing a trailer, and, on any account, excludes a trailer in any circumstances; also, this definition shall be open to the reasonable interpretation of the appropriate officer of the Council from the point of view of judging whether the general meaning and purpose of this order can be taken to embrace the use of a residential or public parking bay by a light goods vehicle in any individual case (regardless of its unladen weight)
"business" means a legitimate trading or commercial activity being carried out at premises in respect of which business rates are paid in the name of a company or partnership, and the meaning of "business" shall at all times be open to the reasonable interpretation of the appropriate officer of the Council from the point of view of judging whether the general meaning and purpose of this order can be taken to embrace in any individual case an application to hold a business permit under Article 20(4) and (5) hereto
"residential exemption permit" means the permit described in Article 20 hereto; if the holder of a non-vehicle-specific permit reports its accidental loss to the appropriate officer of the Council, that officer shall arrange for its replacement at a cost proportionate to the period for which it would otherwise have remained valid (in relation to its original year-long applicability), but, if it is reported accidentally lost on a second occasion or more, it shall be replaced only at full cost, unless clear extenuating circumstances can be held out. A vehicle-specific permit shall always be replaced at proportionate cost
"business address" means the postal address of business premises
"business premises" means any individual property unit not identifiable as a residential property, being premises (in respect of which business rates are paid) which the proper officer of the Council is satisfied can be understood as a place at which legitimate trading or business is carried out by a person seeking application for the business permit mentioned in Article 20(4) and (5) hereto
(8) Insofar as this order may not provide explicit definition of any term, that term shall be interpreted in accordance with any definition of it in the Act, or otherwise according to the context of the order in general.

## (9) Residential Parking Bays

During the charging hours, which shall be from 9.00 am to 5.00 pm on any day (except Saturdays and Sundays) any length of road in Aberdeen specified in the first schedule to this order shall operate as a residential parking bay, to be used for parking only subject to the provisions of this order, except where, within the limits of its markings as such a bay, an indication has been given that part of the bay has been suspended indefinitely by the proper officer of the Council, this to be indicated for the purposes of this order by the establishment on that part of the bay of the white line shown in diagram 1026.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
(10) Insofar as a vehicle is parked during the charging hours on a length of road specified in the first schedule hereto, that vehicle must be left within the limits of its markings as a residential parking bay, and the driver thereof shall exhibit a residential exemption permit on that vehicle.
(11) A residential parking bay shall be used, subject to the provisions of this order, only for the leaving of such vehicles as are able to be parked so as to stand in such a way that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the bay, and also, if relevant, within the limits of individualised designated spaces within the limits of the bay, if such individualised spaces have been established within the marked space.

## Public Parking Bays ("Pay and Display")

(1) During the charging hours, which shall be from 9.00 am to 5.00 pm on any day (except Saturdays and Sundays) each of the lengths of road in Aberdeen specified in the second schedule to this order may be used for parking only subject to the provisions of this order, except where, within the limits of its markings as such a bay, an indication has been given that part of the bay has been suspended indefinitely by the proper officer of the Council, this to be indicated for the purposes of this order by the establishment on that part of the bay of the white line shown in diagram 1026.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
(2) Insofar as a vehicle is parked during the charging hours on one of the lengths of road specified in the second schedule hereto, that vehicle must be left in the limits of its markings as a public parking bay, and the driver thereof shall pay a charge in respect of the parking of the vehicle as provided for in Article 13 below, or else the driver shall display a residential exemption permit as defined in Article 20 hereto.
(3) A public parking bay shall be used, subject to the provisions of this order, only for the leaving of such vehicles as are able to be parked so as to stand in such a way that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the bay, and also, if relevant, within the limits of individualised designated spaces within the limits of the bay, if such individualised designated spaces have been established within the marked space.

## Charges

(1) The charge required to be paid in respect of a vehicle left in one of the lengths of road specified in the second schedule to this order shall be $£ 0.35$ for 30 minutes, $£ 0.75$ for one hour, $£ 1.50$ for two hours, or $£ 2.30$ for a (maximum) period of three hours.
(2) The driver having left the vehicle during the charging hours in one of the lengths of road specified in the second schedule to this order, the relevant charge shall then be payable by the insertion, in a ticket issuing machine relating to that parking bay, of a combination of coins of the denominations indicated on that ticket issuing machine such that their total value - the fee paid - is equal to or exceeds the relevant charge.
(14) (1) After insertion of the fee paid, the driver of the vehicle shall exhibit the ticket issued by the ticket-issuing machine in accordance with the provisions of this Article. No other ticket issued by a ticket-issuing machine shall be exhibited on the vehicle.
(2) The ticket referred to in this article, or the permit referred to in Article 20 hereto, shall (whenever exhibited on a vehicle) be exhibited in a conspicuous position facing forward on the near side of the vehicle behind the glass of the windscreen so that all of the front of the said ticket is clearly visible to a person standing at the near side of the vehicle.
(15) Restriction on Removal of Tickets and Notices

When a ticket has been exhibited on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this order, no person shall transfer such ticket for use on another vehicle.
(16) Where a penalty charge notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this order, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle or a parking attendant, shall remove the notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.
(17) Ticket Issuing Machine to be Installed near Parking Bays

There shall be at least one ticket issuing machine within reasonable walking distance of each public parking bay in respect of which charging is applicable.
(18) Indications by Tickets Issued
(1) Payment of the charge required (by Article 13 hereto) for a vehicle left in a parking bay shall be indicated by the issue and subsequent exhibition of the ticket referred to in Article 14 of this order.
(2) The expiry of the period for which the charge was required shall be presumed (i) if there is exhibited on the vehicle a ticket, issued by a ticket issuing machine relating to the public parking bay in which the vehicle is left, showing the time of expiry of that period and (ii) if the time shown on the clock on the machine is later than the time shown on the ticket.
(19) If, at any time when a vehicle is left in a public parking bay during the charging hours, neither a residential permit nor a business permit nor the ticket referred to in Article 14 hereto is exhibited on that vehicle, it shall be presumed (unless the contrary is proved) that the relevant charge was payable but has not been paid.

## Residential Exemption Permits

(1) Any resident, whose usual place of abode is at premises the address of which is within the area bounded by, but not including, the line of the notional connecting-up of the northside of Queen's Road, moving on to the south side of Albyn Place, then the east side of Albyn Grove, then the south side of Union Grove, and, finally, the east side of Forest Avenue, up to the north side of Queen's Road again, shall be eligible to hold a residential exemption permit at an annual cost of $£ 80$ (for a first permit) or $£ 120$ (for a second permit), which, when displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of his or her vehicle, will allow the vehicle to be left in any residential parking bay, and, also, suspend the need to buy and display an appropriate ticket before making use of any public parking bay, on condition that the bay has been established by virtue of this order, (or by virtue of The Aberdeen City Council (Ashley/Queens Cross)(Zone N)(Traffic Management and Pay and Display ) Order 2010, or by virtue of The Aberdeen City Council (Area 2) (Queens Cross/Rosemount/ Midstocket/Ashley Area, Aberdeen) (Traffic Management) Order 2010), and, in terms of this paragraph, no more than two permits shall be issued in respect of a single address, one of which permits is bound to have the registration number of a single identifiable vehicle entered on it whereas the other may be issued without such vehicle-specificity if the applicant requests this - an applicant who wishes to hold only a single permit may hold a permit of either type - but, where a permit is issued without the registration number of a single identifiable vehicle entered on it, this will be on the strict understanding that the permit is intended for the parking convenience of the resident who has applied for it (including his or her visitors), and on the strict understanding that the permit should not be alienated or disposed of in such a way that the applicant does not still literally or essentially have it in his or her keeping. In particular, a permit must not be sold. If the original applicant, or a resident at the address in question, can no longer produce the permit upon request, it shall be presumed in terms of this order that the permit is no longer held by a resident whose usual place of abode is at premises the address of which is in one of the streets listed above, and, accordingly, any such permit shall no longer have the effect described herein.
(2) The appropriate officer of the Council shall require sight of any suitable documentation in connection with the need to determine whether or not an applicant to hold a residential exemption permit is eligible to do so.

Any person eligible to hold a residential exemption permit in accordance with this Article shall also be eligible to obtain, from the appropriate officer of the Council, a concessionary ticket to allow any visitor to his or her address to park a passenger vehicle in any parking bay established by this order; one of these tickets, when displayed in a conspicuous position
on the windscreen of the visitor's vehicle, will suspend the provisions of this order in regard to the parking of that vehicle, but only in respect of the need to buy and display the ticket referred to in Article 14 hereto, (or a residential, business or contractors' permit) before making use of a residential or public parking bay established by virtue of this order but, in terms of this sub-paragraph, no resident eligible to hold a residential exemption permit shall be eligible to obtain more than a maximum yearly allocation of 15 such concessionary tickets for visitors' parking, and the cost of obtaining any one concessionary ticket (up to the aforementioned yearly maximum of 15 ) shall be $50 \%$ of the cost of the current highest rate for one day's off-street parking in an off-street car park operated by the City Council, and no such ticket shall be held by a resident eligible to hold a residential exemption permit if more than 15 such tickets have already been issued in respect of his or her individual address, and, otherwise, such tickets shall only be issued in respect of any individual address to the extent that the maximum number of 15 tickets has not been taken up in respect of that address as a result of earlier applications in the relevant operational year.
(4) Any person who is not a resident eligible to hold a residential permit in terms of this Article, but who is engaged in registered trade at premises the address of which would otherwise have attracted eligibility to hold such a permit, shall by virtue of this Article be eligible to hold one or two permits of a special type (associated in each case with a single identifiable vehicle of which the respective permit holder is owner or keeper) issued in relation to any shop or business the premises of which are located in one of the lengths of road specified in that paragraph, being a shop or business which the applicant can demonstrate satisfactorily that he or she represents.
(5) Any person eligible to hold a permit in terms of the foregoing paragraph i.e. not a resident but be a person representing a business situated at an address which would otherwise be a qualifying address from the point of view of residential eligibility - shall be eligible to hold a permit only on behalf of the business which he or she represents, and that business shall be obliged to pay an annual cost of $£ 160$ for such a permit, and this permit shall be issued in respect of a single identifiable vehicle the registration number of which shall be inscribed on the permit, and no more than two such permits shall be held by any one shop or business.

## (21) Exemptions from Parking Charges and Time Limits

(1) If, at the time when a vehicle is left during the charging hours in a public parking bay defined in the second schedule hereto, there are on all of the ticket issuing machines relating to that parking bay notices placed by any person duly authorised by the Council indicating that the ticket issuing machines are out of order, that vehicle shall be exempt from the initial charge, provided that it is removed prior to the commencement of the next period of charging hours after the first of the ticket issuing machines relating to that marked parking bay has been rectified. If the vehicle is not removed before that period, the initial charge shall be treated as having been incurred at the time that the first of the ticket issuing machines
relating to that parking bay was rectified, and the provisions of the order shall apply accordingly.
(2) An invalid carriage, or a disabled person's vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge issued by a local authority, shall be exempt from payment of any charge, or from compliance with any limitation of time during which a vehicle may be left in a marked parking bay, and, also, for the purposes of a residential parking bay, shall be treated as it if were displaying a residential exemption permit.
(3) Any vehicle of the type specified hereinunder may wait anywhere on a length of carriageway specified in the first and second schedules to this order; namely:-
(a) vehicles being used for fire and rescue, ambulance or police force purposes; or
(b) vehicles, not being passenger vehicles, being used in the service of the local roads authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties, provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or duties or the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait at that location.

## (22) Movement of Vehicles in Parking Bays in Emergencies

Where necessary and reasonable, a police constable in uniform, or any person duly authorised by the Council, may move (or cause to be moved) any vehicle left in a parking bay.
(23) Power to Suspend Use of Parking Bays
(1) Any person duly authorised in that behalf by the Council may suspend the use of a parking bay whenever and for such period as he or she may consider necessary and reasonable.
(2) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any part of a parking bay during such period as there is, in or adjacent to that part of the bay, a sign in pursuance of the immediately preceding sub-paragraph.
(24) Contractors' Permits
(1) Any contractor who believes that he or she (or his or her firm or company) is likely to be engaged commercially upon building or servicing works at premises adjacent to any length of road specified in either of the first two schedules hereto may be eligible to hold a contractors' permit at a cost of $£ 50$ a month, or $£ 550$ a year. Such a ticket, when held properly in accordance with this Article and displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of that contractor's vehicle during such building or servicing works as attracted eligibility to hold the permit, will suspend the provisions of this order in regard to the parking of that vehicle at that time, in respect of any need to display a permit or ticket in accordance with Articles 9-21 hereto and, also, this permit shall have the equivalent effect
in respect of any other traffic regulation order made by Aberdeen City Council (or an antecedent or successor authority) providing for public or residential parking bays equivalent to those provided for by this order.
(2) No person shall be eligible to hold a contractors' permit unless the appropriate officer of the Council is satisfied that the commercial activity in respect of which application is being made is able to be characterised directly in terms of one of the following trading categories -

- Aerial installation
- Bathroom fitting
- Building
- Carpentry
- Carpet fitting
- Painting and decorating
- Insulation installation
- Electrical installation and gas maintenance
- Joinery
- Kitchen fitting
- Masonry
- Painting
- Plumbing
- Roofing
- Tiling
- Window fitting
- and that that activity is one which it would be unreasonable to expect be conducted without the contractor's vehicle being directly outside the property at which the work is being carried out, and, in particular, there shall be no eligibility where the proximity of the contractor's vehicle is merely a matter of convenience.
(3) Any question of eligibility may be tested retrospectively if the proper officer of the Council has cause to believe that a contractor's permit has been obtained legitimately in terms of the information held out by the applicant to the Council but has subsequently been used for parking a vehicle in circumstances outwith the requirements of the foregoing paragraph, and the Council shall have the right to withdraw or invalidate a contractor's permit if the proper officer of the Council is satisfied it has been knowingly misused in this way.

## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

## THE ABERDEEN CITY COUNCIL (CITY CENTRE) (ON-STREET CAR CLUB PARKING SPACES) ORDER 2012

Aberdeen City Council, in exercise of its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "The 1984 Act"), and in exercise of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Grampian Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, and having complied with the requirements of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 2002, hereby makes the following order:-

## (1) Citation

This order may be cited as "The Aberdeen City Council (City Centre) (On-Street Car Club Parking Spaces) Order 2012" and shall come into operation on 15 March, 2012.

## (2) Definitions in relation to subsequent Articles

In the following Articles hereto, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them.
"the Act" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended
"order" means "The Aberdeen City Council (City Centre) (On-Street Car Club Parking Spaces) Order 2012"
"Article" means an article of this Order;
"Schedule" means a Schedule to this Order;
"car club vehicle" means a vehicle with the appropriate livery and displaying a car club parking sign, provided for the use of persons, who have paid the relevant membership fee and by means of an advance booking system and payment of charges may have access to the vehicle for a specified period as envisaged in Article 3 hereto.
"driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a Car Club parking place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in such a parking place.
"parking space" means a space provided for the leaving of a vehicle in a car club parking place.
"length of road", where referred to in relation to the first, schedule hereto, means the section of carriageway adjacent to the kerb on the
stated side of that length of road, which section shall be marked out and signed as a parking place in terms of section 50 of the 1984 Act to accommodate the parking of a car club vehicle; namely, a vehicle which displays the appropriate livery agreed by the local authority.
"car club parking bay" means one of the lengths of road specified in the first schedule hereto, a parking place designated by this order and provided (subject to the limits of its markings) for the leaving of car club vehicles.
"the limits of its markings", as the expression is used in this order, means the limits of a residential or public parking bay (or, if relevant, the limits of an individualised space within such a bay).
"parking attendant" means a person authorised by, or on behalf of, the Council to supervise parking bays and issue penalty charge notices.
"traffic sign" means a sign of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised under or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under Section 64 of the 1984 Act and includes any line or mark on a road for conveying warnings, information, requirements, restrictions or prohibitions.
"vehicle" means a passenger vehicle.
(3) Car Club Membership
(1) Any person or business, having provided the documentation required by Aberdeen City Council, is eligible to become a member of the car club established by the Council for the purposes of this order, this at a one-off cost of $£ 25$. Once a member, an individual can by means of the associated electronic or telephone advance booking scheme and payment of the defined charge in accordance with Article 4 hereto, have access to the vehicle for a specified period.
(2) No person shall be eligible to be a car club member unless the appropriate officer of the Council is satisfied that they have provided the relevant documentation.
(3) Any question of eligibility may be tested retrospectively if the proper officer of the Council has cause to believe that a nonmember has been the driver of the car club vehicle.
(4) Charges

The charge required to be paid in respect of a car club vehicle shall be $£ 4$ per hour and shall vary between 18 and 20 pence per mile.
(5)

## Car Club Parking Places

(1) Each of the lengths of road in Aberdeen specified in the schedule to this order shall operate as a car club parking bay, to be used for parking only subject to the provisions of this order.
(2) Insofar as a car club vehicle is parked on a length of road specified in the first schedule hereto, that vehicle must be left within the limits of its markings as a car club parking bay.
(3) Where a parking attendant is of the opinion that any of the provisions contained in Articles 3 or 4 have been contravened or not complied with in respect of a vehicle left in a car club parking place, he may remove or cause to be removed the vehicle from the car club parking place and, where it is so removed, shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.
(6) Movement of Vehicles in Parking Bays in Emergencies

Where necessary and reasonable, a police constable in uniform, or any person duly authorised by the Council, may move (or cause to be moved) any vehicle left in a car club parking bay.

## (7) Power to Suspend Use of Parking Bays

(1) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a car club parking place or any part thereof when he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-
(a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
(b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the car club parking place, the cleansing or lighting of the road, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road or street furniture therein or thereon, the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to the car club parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus, or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign;
(c) for the convenience of occupiers adjacent to the car club parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
(d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
(e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the car club parking place at times of funerais or other special occasions.
(2) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any part of a parking bay during such period as there is, in or adjacent to that part of the bay, a sign in pursuance of the immediately preceding sub-paragraph.
(8) Upon the coming into effect of this order, any previous order providing for a prohibition of waiting on any of the lengths of road specified in the schedule hereto is hereby revoked to the extent of its application to that length of road.

## THE ABERDEEN CITY COUNCIL (DISABLED PERSONS' PARKING PLACES IN ABERDEEN) (REGULATORY PARKING PLACES) (AREA 4) ORDER 2013

Aberdeen City Council, in exercise of its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "The 1984 Act"); its duties under the Disabled Persons' Parking Places (Scotland) Act 2009; and in exercise of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Grampian Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, and having complied with the requirements of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1999, hereby makes the following order:-

## Citation

(1) This order may be cited as "The Aberdeen City Council (Disabled Persons' Parking Places in Aberdeen) (Regulatory Parking Places) (Area 4) Order 2013" and shall come into operation on 5 June, 2013.

## (2) Definitions in relation to subsequent Articles

In the following Articles hereto, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-
"Article" means an article of this Order;
"city warden" means a person employed by the roads authority as a city warden in pursuance of section 63A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Road Traffic Act 1991;
"Council" means Aberdeen City Council;
"disabled person" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Scotland) Regulations 2000;
"disabled person's badge" means: -
(i) a badge issued under section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970;
(ii) a badge issued under a provision of the law of Northern Ireland corresponding to that section; or
(iii) a badge issued, corresponding to that section, by a State that is a member or an associate of the European Conference of Ministers of Transport
"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in S142 (1) of the 1984 Act;
"driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a disabled parking place means the person driving the vehicle as the time it was left in such a parking place;
"owner" in relation to a vehicle, means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used, and "owned" shall be constructed accordingly;
"parking space" means a space provided for the leaving of a vehicle in a disabled parking place;
"penalty charge" means the charge payable in respect of all contraventions of this order
"Schedule" means the Schedule to this order;
"traffic sign" means a sign of any size, colour, and type prescribed or authorised under, or having effect as thought prescribed or authorised under Part V of the 1984 Act;
"vehicle" means a motor vehicle;

## Designation of disabled parking places

3. Each length of road specified in the Schedule hereto is designated as a disabled parking place only.

## Vehicles for which disabled parking places are designated

4. Each disabled parking place described in the Schedule may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving at any time such disabled persons' vehicles which have been or are to be driven by a disabled person or have been or are to be used for carrying disabled persons as passengers and which display a disabled person's badge in accordance with Article 11.

## Placing of traffic signs, etc

5. The Council shall: -
(a) cause the limits of each disabled parking place and of each parking space to be indicated by appropriate traffic signs or road markings;
(b) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of this Order and the satisfactory operation of each disabled parking place.

## Removal of vehicle from a disabled parking place

6. When a vehicle is left in any parking space in contravention of any of the provisions of this order, a person authorised in that behalf, by or on behalf of the Council, may remove, or arrange to have removed, the said vehicle from the parking space. The Council may, by written notice, require the owner of such vehicle to remove the vehicle from a parking space, or from any place to which it has been removed for safe custody.

## Movement of vehicle in disabled parking place in emergency

7. Where necessary and reasonable, a police constable in uniform, or any person duly authorised by the Council, may move (or cause to be moved) any vehicle left in a parking space.

## Manner of moving vehicles

8. Any person removing any vehicle by virtue of Article 6 and Article 7 may do so by towing or driving or moving it in such other manner as they may think necessary to enable them to remove it, provided that in the event of any vehicle being removed from any parking space, such person shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

## Power to suspend use of disabled parking places

9. (1) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a disabled parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary: -
(a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
(b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the disabled parking place, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to the disabled parking place, the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the disabled parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line, traffic sign or parking meter;
(c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the disabled parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
(d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
(e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the disabled parking place at times of funerals or on other special occasions.
(2) A city warden may suspend for not longer than twenty-four hours the use of a disabled parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of faciiltating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
(3) Any person or a police constable suspending the use of a disabled parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) or paragraph (2) of this Article shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that or any part of that disabled parking place the use of which is suspended, a traffic sign or signs indicating that the use of that disabled parking place or that part thereof is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
(4) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any disabled parking place or part thereof during such period as there is in or adjacent to that disabled parking place or part thereof a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article. Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes to wait in that disabled parking place or that part thereof during such period referred to in this paragraph, or any other vehicle so to wait if that vehicle is waiting with the permission of the person suspending the use of the disabled parking place or part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article.

## Restrictions on waiting by vehicles in disabled parking places

10. (1) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Order with respect to vehicles which are left in a disabled parking place in accordance with those provisions, any other vehicle may wait during the permitted hours anywhere in a disabled parking place, other than a disabled parking place or part of a disabled parking place the use of which has been suspended, if: -
(a) The vehicle is waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes, or such longer period as a city warden may approve, to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
(b) The vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident.
(c) The vehicle is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
(d) The vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
(e) The vehicle, not being a passenger vehicle, is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the disabled parking place, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the disabled parking place or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the disabled parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water of electricity or of any telegraphic line, or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign or parking meter;
(f) The vehicle, not being a passenger vehicle, is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling house adjacent to the disabled parking place from or to another office or dwelling house or a depository;
(g) The vehicle is in actual use in connection with a funeral undertaking;
(2) Except as provided in the foregoing provisions of this order, the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit the vehicle to wait in a disabled parking place during the permitted hours.

## Display of Permits

## THE ABERDEEN CITY COUNCIL (DISABLED PERSONS' PARKING PLACES IN ABERDEEN) (REGULATORY PARKING PLACES) (AREA 5) ORDER 2013

Aberdeen City Council, in exercise of its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "The 1984 Act"); its duties under the Disabled Persons' Parking Places (Scotland) Act 2009; and in exercise of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Grampian Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, and having complied with the requirements of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1999, hereby makes the following order:-

## Citation

(1) This order may be cited as "The Aberdeen City Council (Disabled Persons' Parking Places in Aberdeen) (Regulatory Parking Places) (Area 5) Order 2013" and shall come into operation on 5 June, 2013.
(2) Definitions in relation to subsequent Articles

In the following Articles hereto, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-
"Article" means an article of this Order;
"city warden" means a person employed by the roads authority as a city warden in pursuance of section 63A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Road Traffic Act 1991;
"Council" means Aberdeen City Council;
"disabled person" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Scotland) Regulations 2000;
"disabled person's badge" means: -
(i) a badge issued under section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970;
(ii) a badge issued under a provision of the law of Northern Ireland corresponding to that section; or
(iii) a badge issued, corresponding to that section, by a State that is a member or an associate of the European Conference of Ministers of Transport
"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in S142 (1) of the 1984 Act;
"driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a disabled parking place means the person driving the vehicle as the time it was left in such a parking place;
"owner" in relation to a vehicle, means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used, and "owned" shall be constructed accordingly;
"parking space" means a space provided for the leaving of a vehicle in a disabled parking place;
"penalty charge" means the charge payable in respect of all contraventions of this order
"Schedule" means the Schedule to this order;
"traffic sign" means a sign of any size, colour, and type prescribed or authorised under, or having effect as thought prescribed or authorised under Part V of the 1984 Act;
"vehicle" means a motor vehicle;

## Designation of disabled parking places

3. Each length of road specified in the Schedule hereto is designated as a disabled parking place only.

## Vehicles for which disabled parking places are designated

4. Each disabled parking place described in the Schedule may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving at any time such disabled persons' vehicles which have been or are to be driven by a disabled person or have been or are to be used for carrying disabled persons as passengers and which display a disabled person's badge in accordance with Article 11.

## Placing of traffic signs, etc

5. The Council shall: -
(a) cause the limits of each disabled parking place and of each parking space to be indicated by appropriate traffic signs or road markings;
(b) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of this Order and the satisfactory operation of each disabled parking place.

## Removal of vehicle from a disabled parking place

6. When a vehicle is left in any parking space in contravention of any of the provisions of this order, a person authorised in that behalf, by or on behalf of the Council, may remove, or arrange to have removed, the said vehicle from the parking space. The Council may, by written notice, require the owner of such vehicle to remove the vehicle from a parking space, or from any place to which it has been removed for safe custody.

## Movement of vehicle in disabled parking place in emergency

7. Where necessary and reasonable, a police constable in uniform, or any person duly authorised by the Council, may move (or cause to be moved) any vehicle left in a parking space.

## Manner of moving vehicles

8. Any person removing any vehicle by virtue of Article 6 and Article 7 may do so by towing or driving or moving it in such other manner as they may think necessary to enable them to remove it, provided that in the event of any vehicle being removed from any parking space, such person shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

## Power to suspend use of disabled parking places

9. (1) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a disabled parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary: -
(a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
(b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the disabled parking place, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to the disabled parking place, the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the disabled parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line, traffic sign or parking meter;
(c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the disabled parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
(d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
(e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the disabled parking place at times of funerals or on other special occasions.
(2) A city warden may suspend for not longer than twenty-four hours the use of a disabled parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
(3) Any person or a police constable suspending the use of a disabled parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) or paragraph (2) of this Article shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that or any part of that disabled parking place the use of which is suspended, a traffic sign or signs indicating that the use of that disabled parking place or that part thereof is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
(4) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any disabled parking place or part thereof during such period as there is in or adjacent to that disabled parking place or part thereof a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article. Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes to wait in that disabled parking place or that part thereof during such period referred to in this paragraph, or any other vehicle so to wait if that vehicle is waiting with the permission of the person suspending the use of the disabled parking place or part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article.

## Restrictions on waiting by vehicles in disabled parking places

10. (1) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Order with respect to vehicles which are left in a disabled parking place in accordance with those provisions, any other vehicle may wait during the permitted hours anywhere in a disabled parking place, other than a disabled parking place or part of a disabled parking place the use of which has been suspended, if: -
(a) The vehicle is waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes, or such longer period as a city warden may approve, to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
(b) The vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident.
(c) The vehicle is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
(d) The vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
(e) The vehicle, not being a passenger vehicle, is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the disabled parking place, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the disabled parking place or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the disabled parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water of electricity or of any telegraphic line, or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign or parking meter;
(f) The vehicle, not being a passenger vehicle, is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling house adjacent to the disabled parking place from or to another office or dwelling house or a depository;
(g) The vehicle is in actual use in connection with a funeral undertaking;
(2) Except as provided in the foregoing provisions of this order, the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit the vehicle to wait in a disabled parking place during the permitted hours.

## Display of Permits

11. (1) At all times during which a vehicle is left in a disabled parking place in accordance with Article 4 the driver thereof shall display or cause to be displayed a valid disabled person's badge in the following manner: -
(a) the badge is exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle; or
(b) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or facia, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle.
(2) The disabled person's badge referred to in this Article shall be so attached to or displayed on the vehicle that the particulars recorded on the permit are clearly visible to a person standing at the front or the nearside of the vehicle.

#### Abstract

Aberdeen City Council, in exercise of its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "The 1984 Act"), and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Police Scotland in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, and having complied with the requirements of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1999, hereby makes the following order:-


## PART 1

## CITIATION AND DEFINTIONS

## Citation

(1) This order may be cited as "The Aberdeen City Council (Ashley/Queen's Cross) (Zone N) (Controlled Parking and Traffic Management) (Consolidation) Order 2016" and shall come into operation on 10 June 2016.

## (2) Definitions in relation to subsequent Articles

In the following Articles hereto, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them.
"address" means a household identified in the Register of Electors or the Council Tax Valuation List (or any successor of either) as an individual residential property unit identifiable as an individualised postal address in itself, and, on any account, does not mean a residential unit that is not independently habitable, or a residential unit in a nursing home or care home, or suchlike;
"article" means an article of this order;
"business" means a legitimate trading or commercial activity being carried out at premises in respect of which business rates are paid in the name of a company, partnership or sole trader;
"business address" means the postal address of business premises;
"business permit" means the permit described in Article 19 hereto; if the holder of a non-vehicle-specific permit reports its accidental loss to the appropriate officer of the Council, that officer shall arrange for its replacement at a cost proportionate to the period for which it would otherwise have remained valid (in relation to its original year-long applicability), but, if it is reported accidentally lost on a second occasion or more, it shall be replaced only at full cost, unless clear extenuating circumstances can be held out. A vehicle-specific permit shall always be replaced at proportionate cost;
"business premises" means any individual property unit not identifiable as a residential property, being premises (in respect of which business rates are paid) which the proper officer of the Council is satisfied can be understood as a place at which legitimate trading or business is carried out by a person seeking application for the business permit mentioned in Article 19 hereto;
"City Warden" means a person authorised by, or on behalf of, the Council to supervise parking bays and issue penalty charge notices;
"disabled person's badge" means: -
(i) a badge issued under section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970;
(ii) a badge issued under a provision of the law of Northern Ireland corresponding to that section; or
(iii) a badge issued, corresponding to that section, by a State that is a member or an associate of the European Conference of Ministers of Transport;
"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in S142 (1) of the 1984 Act;
"driver", in relation to a vehicle left on any length of road affected by this order, means the person authorised by the owner to drive the vehicle, and, for the avoidance of doubt, includes its owner;
"electronic ticket" means a ticket purchased by way of the park and phone payment system and stored on a hand held device;
"essential business use" in relation to a vehicle, means that vehicle, or vehicles, must be required for use on a daily basis in conjunction with the primary function of the business";
"hand-held device" means a wireless hand-held computer used by a City Warden which is programmed to interface with the telephone payment parking system;
"household" means persons, whether members of the same family or otherwise, occupying any part of a building, being part of which is occupied as a separate dwelling, and, in particular, includes a flat;
"length of road" where referred to in relation to the fourth or fifth schedules hereto, means the section of carriageway adjacent to the kerb on the stated side of that length of road, which section shall be signed as a parking place in terms of the 1984 Act to accommodate the parking of passenger or light goods vehicles (and may or may not be divided into individualised parking spaces for single vehicles);
"light goods vehicle" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description, weighing not more than
3.5 tonnes unladen and not drawing a trailer, and, on any account, excludes a trailer in any circumstances; also, this definition shall be open to the reasonable interpretation of the appropriate officer of the Council from the point of view of judging whether the general meaning and purpose of this order can be taken to embrace the use of a residential or public parking bay by a light goods vehicle in any individual case (regardless of its unladen weight);
"limited off-street car parking" - to be determined by the appropriate officer of the Council at the point of application;
"maximum period of stay" means a maximum period of uninterrupted parking;
"medical practitioner" means a fully registered person as defined in The Medical Act 1983;
"Medical Professionals" means such persons:-
(i) having been identified by NHS Grampian as being a GP, registered nurse, or any other nominated medical persons carrying out domiciliary visits to patients residing within a controlled parking zone;
(ii) such persons as are GP's at qualifying medical practices located within a controlled parking zone and with no or limited off-street car parking, and carrying out domiciliary visits to patients;
"order" means The Aberdeen City Council (Ashley/Queen's Cross) (Zone N) (Controlled Parking and Traffic Management) Order 2016;
"owner" means the registered keeper of the vehicle at the appropriate time;
"park and phone payment system" means a system to facilitate and monitor the payment of parking charges using mobile telephone via communication with the service, in accordance with the instructions indicated on signs located at or in the vicinity of each parking space;
"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than eight passengers exclusive of the driver; the expression "passenger vehicle" includes a motorcycle as defined in the Act and excludes any caravan or trailer in any circumstances;
"public parking bay" means one of the lengths of road specified in the fourth or fifth schedules hereto, a parking place designated by this order and provided (subject to the limits of its markings) for the leaving of vehicles in accordance with the provisions of this order;
"penalty charge" means the charge payable in respect of all contraventions of this order;
"qualifying business" means a business classified as Class 1 Retail Activity or Class 2 Business Activity as defined by the Town and County Planning (Use Classes) (Scotland) Order 1997, the address of which is listed in the sixth schedule to this order.
"qualifying business vehicle" means a vehicle, being necessary for essential business use, with an overall height not exceeding 3.2 m , overall length not exceeding 6.5 m and gross weight not exceeding 5 tonnes and, for the avoidance of doubt, is not drawing a trailer;
"qualifying contractor" means a person employed to undertake maintenance or improvement works at an address other than at which their business is otherwise based, subject to the terms to this order described at Article 23. Such qualifying contractor would be entitled to obtain a fixed citywide permit;
"qualifying contractor's vehicle" means a liveried vehicle with an overall height not exceeding 3.2 metres, overall length not exceeding 6.5 metres, and gross weight not exceeding 5 tonnes and, for the avoidance of doubt is not drawing a trailer;
"qualifying medical practice" means a medical practice with consulting rooms, which has no or limited off-street parking, the address of which is listed in the sixth schedule to this order. Such qualifying medical practice shall be entitled to apply for one vehicle specific permit for each medical professional;
"repair and maintenance garage business" means a business classified as a repair and maintenance garage;
"residential exemption permit" means the permit described in Article 18 hereto; if the holder of a non-vehicle-specific permit reports its accidental loss to the appropriate officer of the Council, that officer shall arrange for its replacement at a cost proportionate to the period for which it would otherwise have remained valid (in relation to its original year-long applicability), but, if it is reported accidentally lost on a second occasion or more, it shall be replaced only at full cost, unless clear extenuating circumstances can be held out. A vehicle-specific permit shall always be replaced at proportionate cost;
"suspended indefinitely" means, in relation to a public parking bay, the suspension of all or part of that bay (by authority of the proper officer of the Council) on the grounds that its use in terms of this order would cause access to a driveway or garage to be obstructed;
"telephone payment parking system" means a system to facilitate and monitor the payment of parking charges using telephone or internet enabled hand-held devices via communication with the service provider, in accordance with the instructions indicated on signs located at or in the vicinity of each parking place;
"the Act" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended;
"the limits of its markings", as the expression is used in this order, means the limits of a residential or public parking bay (or, if relevant, the limits of an individualised space within such a bay);
"ticket" means a ticket issued by a parking meter installed at a parking place;
"vehicle" means a passenger vehicle or light goods vehicle;
(3) Insofar as this order may not provide explicit definition of any term, that term shall be interpreted in accordance with any definition of it in the Act, or otherwise according to the context of the order in general.

## PART 2

## RESTRICTIONS ON WAITING

## Prohibitions of Waiting

(4) Save as provided in articles 6, 7 and 8 of this order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of road specified in the first schedule hereto at any time on any day.
(5) Save as provided in articles 6, 7 and 8 of this order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of road specified in the second schedule hereto between 8.00 am and 6.00 pm on any day except Sundays, or on any of the lengths of road specified in the third schedule hereto between 8.00am and 6.00 pm on any day except Saturdays and Sundays.

## Exemptions Relating to Articles 4 and 5 Above

(6) Nothing in articles 4 or 5 of this order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of road referred to in those articles for so long as may be necessary:
(i) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load thereon or unload therefrom goods or personal luggage;
(ii) when the person in control of the vehicle is:
(a) required by law to stop; or
(b) obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident; or
(c) prevented from proceeding by any circumstances beyond their control, where the said circumstances relate directly to the movement or otherwise of traffic on the road;
(iii) if the vehicle is in material use in connection with a funeral undertaking;
(iv) if the vehicle is in the service of, or is being employed by, a security company and is in actual use while currency or other valuables:
(a) are being unloaded from the vehicle; or
(b) having been unloaded from the vehicle, are being delivered; or
(c) are being collected from premises adjacent to that road for loading onto the vehicle; or
(d) having been collected from such premises, are being loaded onto the vehicle.
(7) Nothing in articles 4 or 5 of this order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in those articles for so long a may be necessary:
(i) to enable a vehicle in actual use or materially necessary for such purpose (provided that the vehicle cannot conveniently be used for the same purpose in any other road) to be used in or adjacent to that road in connection with any:
(a) building operation;
(b) demolition;
(c) laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any electronic communications apparatus; or
(d) excavation,
provided that, in the case of any of the operations described in subparagraphs (c) and (d) above, the said operation or operations are to be conducted within the extents of the road.
(ii) to enable a vehicle in actual use or materially necessary for such purpose (provided that the vehicle cannot conveniently be used for the same purpose in any other road) to be used in connection with the:
(a) cleansing or lighting of any road;
(b) removal of any obstruction to traffic on any road;
(c) maintenance or improvement or reconstruction of any road; or
(d) placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign or parking meter on any road.
(iii) if the vehicle, being a liveried vehicle, is in the service of, or is being employed by, a universal service provider, and is in actual use while postal packets:
(a) addressed to premises adjacent to that road are being unloaded from the vehicle;
(b) addressed to premises adjacent to that road and having been unloaded from the vehicle, are being delivered;
(c) are being collected from postal boxes or premises adjacent to that road for loading onto the vehicle; or
(d) having been so collected, are then being loaded onto the vehicle.
(8) Nothing in articles 4 or 5 of this order shall apply to any invalid carriage or disabled person's vehicle which is not causing an obstruction and which displays in the relevant position a valid disabled person's badge.

## PART 3

## PAY AND DISPLAY PARKING

(9) Public Parking Bays
(i) During the charging hours, which shall be from 8.00am to 8.00 pm on any day (except Sundays) each of the lengths of road in Aberdeen specified in the fourth schedule to this order may be used for parking only subject to the provisions of this order, except where, within the limits of its markings
as such a bay, an indication has been given that part of the bay has been suspended indefinitely by the proper officer of the Council, this to be indicated for the purposes of this order by the establishment on that part of the bay of the white line shown in diagram 1026.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016.
(ii) During the charging hours, which shall be from 8.00am to 8.00pm on any Saturday each of the lengths of road in Aberdeen specified in the fifth schedule to this order may be used for parking only subject to the provisions of this order, except where, within the limits of its markings as such a bay, an indication has been given that part of the bay has been suspended indefinitely by the proper officer of the Council, this to be indicated for the purposes of this order by the establishment on that part of the bay of the white line shown in diagram 1026.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016.
(iii) Insofar as a vehicle is parked during the charging hours on one of the lengths of road specified in the fourth or fifth schedules hereto, that vehicle must be left in the limits of its markings as a public parking bay, and the driver thereof shall pay a charge in respect of the parking of the vehicle as provided for in Article 10 below, or else the driver shall display a residential exemption permit as defined in Article 18 hereto, or else the driver thereof shall pay the penalty charge defined in Article 11 hereto.
(iv) A public parking bay shall be used, subject to the provisions of this order, only for the leaving of such vehicles as are able to be parked so as to stand in such a way that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the bay, and also, if relevant, within the limits of individualised designated spaces within the limits of the bay, if such individualised designated spaces have been established within the marked space.

## Charges

(i) The charge required to be paid in respect of a vehicle left in one of the lengths of road specified in the fourth or fifth schedules to this order shall be $£ 0.50$ for 30 minutes, $£ 1.00$ for one hour, $£ 2.00$ for two hours, or $£ 3.00$ for a (maximum) period of three hours.
(ii) The driver of a vehicle who causes it to be left in one of the lengths of road specified in the fourth or fifth schedules to this order during the charging hours for more than 30 minutes, one hour, two hours or three hours (these being the four chargeable period of stay available during charging hours in any one day, or over a combination of parts of periods and successive days) shall be obliged to pay a penalty charge as defined in Article 11;
(iii) The driver having left the vehicle during the charging hours in one of the lengths of road specified in the fourth or fifth schedule to this order, the relevant charge shall then be payable by one of the following means:
(a) the insertion, in a ticket issuing machine relating to that parking bay, of a combination of coins of the denominations indicated on
that ticket issuing machine such that their total value - the fee paid - is equal to or exceeds the relevant charge. After insertion of the fee paid, the driver of the vehicle shall exhibit the ticket issued by the ticket-issuing machine in accordance with the provisions of this article. No other ticket issued by a ticket-issuing machine shall be exhibited on the vehicle; or
(b) "park and phone" method of payment may be used for public parking bays to pay for the initial charge. If this method is used, registration of payment must be made by phone or electronic means. On the first use only, the driver shall register the credit or debit card payment details and the relevant registration number of the vehicle being left at the car park, along with the location number of where they wish to park and the duration. Thereafter, on all other occasions, the driver shall provide the location number of the car parking place, the duration that they wish to park and the CVV2 code of the registered credit or debit card, or any other such details the Council may require in order for a relevant payment to be made for the required time of use of the parking place. Where a driver has made payment through the telephone payment parking system, an indication that payment of the parking charge has been made shall appear on a hand-held device, operated by City Wardens.
(iv) The ticket referred to in this article shall (whenever exhibited on a vehicle) be exhibited in a conspicuous position facing forward on the near side of the vehicle behind the glass of the windscreen so that the entire front of the said ticket is clearly visible to a person standing at the near side of the vehicle.

## Penalty Charge

(i) A charge amounting to sixty pounds (which amount shall hereinafter be known as the "penalty charge") shall be payable, in addition to relevant charge which may already have been paid as required in the preceding article, when a vehicle is left in one of the lengths of road specified in the fourth or fifth schedule to this order, in respect of which charging is applicable, for longer than the period for which payment of the relevant charge was made, and, furthermore, a penalty charge shall be payable whenever the requirements of Articles 9 and 10 have been contravened.
(ii) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which the penalty charge has been incurred, it shall be the duty of the parking supervisor to attach to the vehicle, in a conspicuous position, a notice which shall include:-
(a) the registration mark of the vehicle or, when the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle;
(b) the time at which he or she first notices (i) that, the initial charge having been paid, the ticket obtained from the ticket issuing
machine has not been exhibited on the vehicle in accordance with the provisions of the order, or (ii) that the vehicle has been left in a parking bay during charging hours for longer than the period for which payment of the appropriate initial charge has been made, or (iii) that the vehicle has been parked such that it does not conform with the manner of standing specified in this order; or (iv) an apparent breach of the relevant provisions contained in this order.
(c) a statement that the excess charge of Sixty Pounds requires to be paid;
(d) the manner in which and the time within which, and also any special conditions according to which, the excess charge should or can be paid; and
(e) a statement that a driver who fails to pay any excess charge shall be guilty of an offence in terms of the Act;

## (12) Restriction on Removal of Tickets and Notices

When a ticket has been exhibited on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this order, no person shall transfer such ticket for use on another vehicle.
(13) Where a penalty charge notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this order, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle or a City Warden, shall remove the notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.
(14) Ticket Issuing Machine to be Installed near Parking Bays

There shall be at least one ticket issuing machine within reasonable walking distance of each public parking bay in respect of which charging is applicable.
(15) Park and Phone Payment Signage

There shall be at least one sign with clear instructions regarding the park and phone method of payment within reasonable walking distance of each public parking bay in respect of which charging is applicable.
(16) Indications by Tickets Issued or Park and Phone Notification on the Hand Held Device
(i) Payment of the charge required by Article 10 hereto for a vehicle left in a parking bay shall be indicated by the issue and subsequent exhibition of the ticket referred to in Article (10)(iii)(a) of this order, or on the hand held device referred to in Article (10)(iii)(b).
(ii) The expiry of the period for which the charge was required shall be presumed if there is exhibited on the vehicle a ticket, issued by a ticket issuing machine, or an electronic ticket held on a hand held device, relating to the public parking bay in which the vehicle is left, showing the time of expiry of that period and if the time shown on the clock on the
machine is later than the time shown on the ticket, or an electronic ticket held on a hand held device.
(17) If, at any time when a vehicle is left in a public parking bay during the charging hours and a permit of any type referred to in articles $18,19,20,21,22$ and 23 is not exhibited on that vehicle, or alternatively a ticket referred to in Article 10 has not been exhibited on the vehicle, and no indication appears on a hand-held device that the parking charge has been paid, it shall be presumed (unless the contrary is proved or provided the vehicle was exempt by virtue of article 24) that the relevant charge was payable but has not been paid.

## PART 4

## PERMITS

(18) Residential Exemption Permits
(i) Any resident, whose usual place of abode is at premises the address of which is listed in the sixth schedule hereto shall be eligible to hold a residential exemption permit for this specific zone only at an annual cost of $£ 50$ (for a first permit) or $£ 120$ (for a second permit), which, when displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of his or her vehicle, will allow the vehicle to be left in any residential parking bay, and, also, suspend the need to buy and display an appropriate ticket before making use of any public parking bay, on condition that the bay has been established by virtue of this order, and, in terms of this paragraph, no more than two permits shall be issued in respect of a single address, one of which permits is bound to have the registration number of a single identifiable vehicle entered on it whereas the other may be issued without such vehicle-specificity if the applicant requests this - an applicant who wishes to hold only a single permit may hold a permit of either type - but, where a permit is issued without the registration number of a single identifiable vehicle entered on it, this will be on the strict understanding that the permit is intended for the parking convenience of the resident who has applied for it (including his or her visitors), and on the strict understanding that the permit should not be alienated or disposed of in such a way that the applicant does not still literally or essentially have it in his or her keeping. In particular, a permit must not be sold. If the original applicant, or a resident at the address in question, can no longer produce the permit upon request, it shall be presumed in terms of this order that the permit is no longer held by a resident whose usual place of abode is at premises the address of which is in one of the streets listed above, and, accordingly, any such permit shall no longer have the effect described herein.
(ii) The appropriate officer of the Council shall require sight of any suitable documentation in connection with the need to determine whether or not an applicant to hold a residential exemption permit is eligible to do so.
(iii) Any person eligible to hold a residential exemption permit in accordance with this Article shall also be eligible to obtain, from the appropriate officer of the Council, a concessionary ticket to allow any visitor to his or her
address to park a passenger vehicle in any parking bay established by this order; one of these tickets, when displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of the visitor's vehicle, will suspend the provisions of this order in regard to the parking of that vehicle, but only in respect of the need to buy and display the ticket referred to in Article 10 hereto (or a residential exemption, business or contractors' permit) before making use of a residential or public parking bay established by virtue of this order but, in terms of this sub-paragraph, no resident eligible to hold a residential exemption permit shall be eligible to obtain more than a maximum yearly allocation of 15 such concessionary tickets for visitors' parking, and the cost of obtaining any one concessionary ticket (up to the aforementioned yearly maximum of 15) shall be $50 \%$ of the cost of the current highest rate for one day's off-street parking in an off-street car park operated by the City Council, and no such ticket shall be held by a resident eligible to hold a residential exemption permit if more than 15 such tickets have already been issued in respect of his or her individual address, and, otherwise, such tickets shall only be issued in respect of any individual address to the extent that the maximum number of 15 tickets has not been taken up in respect of that address as a result of earlier applications in the relevant operational year.

## Business Permits

(i) A business classified as Class 1 Retail Activity or Class 2 Business Activity as defined by the Town and County Planning (Use Classes) (Scotland) Order 1997 the address of which is listed in the sixth schedule hereto, shall be eligible to apply for a business permit for this specific zone only.
(ii) Such qualifying businesses shall be eligible to apply for up to two business permits for this specific zone, at an annual cost of $£ 500.00$ which, when displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of his or her vehicle, will allow the vehicle to be left in any public parking bay, and, also, suspend the need to buy and display an appropriate ticket before making use of any public parking bay, on condition that the bay has been established by virtue of this order, and, in terms of this paragraph, no more than two permits shall be issued in respect of a qualifying business or single address, one of which permits is bound to have the registration number of a single identifiable vehicle entered on it whereas the other may be issued without such vehicle-specificity if the applicant requests this - an applicant who wishes to hold only a single permit may hold a permit of either type - but, where a permit is issued without the registration number of a single identifiable vehicle entered on it, this will be on the strict understanding that the permit is intended for the operational requirements of the business, and on the strict understanding that the permit should not be alienated or disposed of in such a way that the applicant does not still literally or essentially have it in his or her keeping. In particular, a permit must not be sold.
(iii) The Council may at any time require a qualifying business applying for a business permit to produce to an officer of the Council:
(a) in respect of an application for a permit, such evidence as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them; or
(b) in respect of any previously issued permit, such evidence as they may reasonably require to verify that the permit is valid and/or that the permit holder remains entitled to the said permit.
(iv) If the original applicant, can no longer produce the permit(s) upon request, it shall be presumed in terms of this order that the permit is no longer held by the business whose usual place of abode is at premises the address of which is listed in the sixth schedule hereto and, accordingly, any such permit shall no longer have the effect described herein.

## (20) Repair and Maintenance Garage Business Permits

(i) Any repair and maintenance garage business whose premises the address of which is listed in the sixth schedule hereto shall be eligible to hold up to two repair and maintenance garage permits for that specific zone only at an annual cost of $£ 500.00$ for each permit, which, when displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of his or her vehicle, will allow the vehicle to be left in any public parking bay, and, also, suspend the need to buy and display an appropriate ticket before making use of any public parking bay, on condition that the bay has been established by virtue of this order, and, in terms of this paragraph, no more than two permits shall be issued in respect of a single address, one of which permits is bound to have the registration number of a single identifiable vehicle entered on it whereas the other may be issued without such vehicle-specificity if the applicant requests this - an applicant who wishes to hold only a single permit may hold a permit of either type - but, where a permit is issued without the registration number of a single identifiable vehicle entered on it, this will be on the strict understanding that the permit is intended for the parking requirements of the business, and on the strict understanding that the permit should not be alienated or disposed of in such a way that the applicant does not still literally or essentially have it in his or her keeping. In particular, a permit must not be sold.
(ii) in addition to Article 20(i), a qualifying repair and maintenance garage business shall also be eligible to apply for two additional non vehicle specific permits for this specific zone only should they be able to evidence to the appropriate officer of the Council that they have no or limited offstreet car parking for their business requirements. Any such application shall be made in accordance with the procedure prescribed by the Council, which may be varied from time to time by the Council.
(iii) The Council may at any time require a repair and maintenance garage business applying for a repair and maintenance business permit(s) to produce to an officer of the Council:
(a) in respect of an application for a permit, such evidence as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them: or
(b) in respect of any previously issued permit, such evidence as they may reasonably require to verify that the permit is valid and/or that the permit holder remains entitled to the said permit.
(iv) If the original applicant, can no longer produce the permit(s) upon request, it shall be presumed in terms of this order that the permit is no longer held by the business whose usual place of abode is at premises the address of which is listed in the sixth schedule hereto and, accordingly, any such permit shall no longer have the effect described herein.

## (21) Contractors' Permits

(i) Any contractor who believes that he or she (or his or her firm or company) is likely to be engaged commercially upon building or servicing works at premises adjacent to any length of road specified in the fourth or fifth schedules hereto may be eligible to hold a citywide contractors' permit at a cost of $£ 50$ a month, or $£ 550$ a year. Such a permit, when held properly in accordance with this Article and displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of that contractor's vehicle during such building or servicing works as attracted eligibility to hold the permit, will suspend the provisions of this order in regard to the parking of that vehicle at that time, in respect of any need to display a permit or ticket in accordance with Article 10 hereto and, also, this permit shall have the equivalent effect in respect of any other traffic regulation order made by Aberdeen City Council (or an antecedent or successor authority) providing for public parking bays equivalent to those provided for by this order.
(ii) No person shall be eligible to hold a contractors' permit unless the appropriate officer of the Council is satisfied that the commercial activity in respect of which application is being made is able to be characterised directly in terms of one of the following trading categories -

- Aerial installation
- Bathroom fitting
- Building
- Carpentry
- Carpet fitting
- Painting and decorating
- Insulation installation
- Electrical installation and gas maintenance
- Joinery
- Kitchen fitting
- Masonry
- Painting
- Plumbing
- Roofing
- Tiling
- Window fitting
- and that that activity is one which it would be unreasonable to expect be conducted without the contractor's vehicle being directly outside the property at which the work is being carried out, and, in particular, there
shall be no eligibility where the proximity of the contractor's vehicle is merely a matter of convenience.
(iii) Any question of eligibility may be tested retrospectively if the proper officer of the Council has cause to believe that a contractor's permit has been obtained legitimately in terms of the information held out by the applicant to the Council but has subsequently been used for parking a vehicle in circumstances outwith the requirements of the foregoing paragraph, and the Council shall have the right to withdraw or invalidate a contractor's permit if the proper officer of the Council is satisfied it has been knowingly misused in this way.


## (22) Medical Professional Permits

(i) NHS Grampian may apply to the Council for the issue of citywide permits for use on qualifying vehicles, the keepers of which are medical professionals employed by NHS Grampian, at an annual charge of $£ 200.00$, and any such application shall be made in accordance with the procedure prescribed by the Council, which may be varied from time to time by the Council.
(ii) On receipt of a valid application the Council shall issue to NHS Grampian, a permit which, when displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of a vehicle, will allow the vehicle to be left in any public parking bay, and, also, suspend the need to buy and display an appropriate ticket before making use of any public parking bay.
(iii) The Council may at any time require NHS Grampian applying for a medical professional permit to produce to an officer of the Council:
(a) in respect of an application for a permit, such evidence as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them: or
(b) in respect of any previously issued permit, such evidence as they may reasonably require to verify that the permit is valid and/or that the medical professional permit holder remains entitled to the said permit.
(23) Medical Practice Permits
(i) Any medical practice whose at premises the address of which is listed in the sixth schedule hereto, and has no or limited off-street parking, shall be eligible to apply for a medical practice permit for each medical practitioner, for that specific zone only, at an annual cost of $£ 200.00$, which, when displayed in a conspicuous position on the windscreen of his or her vehicle, will allow the vehicle to be left in any public parking bay, and, also, suspend the need to buy and display an appropriate ticket before making use of any public parking bay, on condition that the bay has been established by virtue of this order.
(ii) Any qualifying medical practice may apply to the Council for the issue of permits for use on a qualifying vehicle, and any such application shall be
made in accordance with the procedure prescribed by the Council, which procedure may be varied from time to time by the Council.

## Exemptions from Parking Charges and Time Limits

(i) If, at the time when a vehicle is left during the charging hours in a public parking bay defined in the fourth or fifth schedules hereto, there are on all of the ticket issuing machines relating to that parking bay notices placed by any person duly authorised by the Council indicating that the ticket issuing machines are out of order, that vehicle shall be exempt from the initial charge, provided that it is removed prior to the commencement of the next period of charging hours after the first of the ticket issuing machines relating to that marked parking bay has been rectified. If the vehicle is not removed before that period, the initial charge shall be treated as having been incurred at the time that the first of the ticket issuing machines relating to that parking bay was rectified, and the provisions of the order shall apply accordingly.
(ii) A disabled person's vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge, shall be exempt from payment of any charge, or from compliance with any limitation of time during which a vehicle may be left in a public parking bay.
(iii) Any vehicle of the type specified hereinunder may wait anywhere on a length of carriageway specified in the fourth or fifth schedules to this order; namely:-
(a) vehicles being used for fire and rescue, ambulance or police force purposes; or
(b) vehicles, not being passenger vehicles, being used in the service of the local roads authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties, provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or duties or the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait at that location.

## Removal of Vehicle from Parking Bay

(i) When a vehicle is left in any publc parking bay in contravention of any of the provisions of this order, a person authorised in that behalf, by or on behalf of the Council, may remove, or arrange to have removed, the said vehicle from the parking bay. When a vehicle is left in a parking bay, in a position other than a position in which it may wait in accordance with this order, a person authorised in that behalf, by or on behalf of the Council, may later, or cause to be altered, the position of the vehicle. The Council may, by written notice, require the owner of such vehicle to remove the vehicle from a parking bay, or from any place to which it has been removed for safe custody.
(ii) Any person removing, or altering the position of, any vehicle by virtue of this Article may do so by towing or driving or moving it in such other manner as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its
position, as the case may be, provided that in the event of any vehicle being removed from any parking bay, such person shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.
(26) Movement of Vehicles in Parking Bays in Emergencies

Where necessary and reasonable, a police constable in uniform, or any person duly authorised by the Council, may move (or cause to be moved) any vehicle left in a public parking bay.
(27) Power to Suspend Use of Parking Bays
(i) Any person duly authorised in that behalf by the Council may suspend the use of a public parking bay whenever and for such period as he or she may consider necessary and reasonable.
(ii) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any part of a public parking bay during such period as there is, in or adjacent to that part of the bay, a sign in pursuance of the immediately preceding sub-paragraph.
(iii) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any part of a public parking bay during such period as there is, in or adjacent to that part of the parking bay, a sign in pursuance of the immediately preceding paragraph, provided that nothing in this paragraph shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes to be left in any part of a parking bay during such period as is referred to in this paragraph, or any other vehicle to be so left if that vehicle is left with the permission of:-
(a) the person suspending the use of the parking bay or part thereof in pursuance of this Article; or
(b) a police constable in uniform.

## PART 5

## OTHER TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT

(28) No person shall drive, or cause or permit to be driven, any vehicle on Hartington Road, Aberdeen, between its junctions with St. Swithin Street and Stanley Street, other than in an easterly direction.

## PART 6

## REVOCATION OR AMENDMENT OF ORDERS

(29) Upon the coming into effect of this order, the following orders are hereby revoked:-

The Aberdeen City Council (Ashley/ Queen's Cross) (Zone N) (Traffic Management and Pay and Display) Order 2000

The Aberdeen City Council (Ashley/ Queen's Cross) (Zone N) (Traffic Management and Pay and Display) Order 2010
(30) Upon the coming into effect of this order, any previous enactment providing for a measure contained within this order shall hereby be revoked to the extent of that measure only.

West side, from a point 76 metres or thereby south of its junction with Albyn Place, southwards for a distance of 4.5 metres or thereby.

West side, from a point 84.5 metres or thereby south of its junction with Albyn Place, southwards for a distance of 4.5 metres or thereby.

West side, from its junction with Albyn Lane, northwards for a distance of 10 metres or thereby.

West side, from its junction with Albyn Lane, southwards for a distance of 11.5 metres or thereby.

West side, from its junction with Stanley Street, southwards for a distance of 3 metres or thereby.

West side, from its junction with Union Grove, northwards for a distance of 15 metres or thereby.

East side, from its junction with Albyn Place, southwards for a distance of 24 metres or thereby.

East side, from its junction with Albyn Lane, northwards for a distance of 14.5 metres or thereby.

East side, from its junction with Albyn Lane, southwards for a distance of 10 metres or thereby.

East side, from its junction with Union Grove, northwards for a distance of 13.5 metres or thereby.

## Albyn Lane

North side, from its junction with Albyn Grove, eastwards for a distance of 80 metres or thereby.

North side, from a point 104 metres or thereby east from its junction with Albyn Grove, eastwards for a distance of 15.5 metres or thereby.

North side, from a point 182 metres or thereby east from its junction with Albyn Grove, eastwards for a distance of 6 metres or thereby.

North side, from a point 191.5 metres or thereby east from its junction with Albyn Grove, eastwards for a distance of 21 metres or thereby.

North side, from a point 220 metres or thereby east from its junction with Albyn Grove, eastwards for a distance of 6.5 metres or thereby.

North side, from a point 236.5 metres or thereby east from its junction with Albyn Grove, eastwards for a distance of 5 metres or thereby.

North side, from a point 249.5 metres or thereby east from its junction with Albyn Grove, eastwards for a distance of 69 metres or thereby.
