## Subject: Proposed new AFC Stadium Development at Kingsford.

Thank you for your response to our earlier letter highlighting the importance and benefits of bringing a new community sports hub, training facilities and a stadium to the city and region - we are in the process of organising briefings for all new Councillors and MPs and will be in touch shortly with proposed dates. However, in the meantime, we continue to work with all stakeholders to ensure we fully address any genuine and perceived areas of concern in the run-up to the pre-determination hearing.

With regards to Pittodrie Stadium, the outline planning application for residential development remains in place and, should we secure planning consent for the development at Kingsford, our current site will be marketed to developers wishing to build residential homes (including an allocation of affordable housing) in this location.

We also recognize that several local bars around Pittodrie Stadium have benefited from our match day attendances for decades and the Club is in dialogue with various AFC supporters' groups as part of our transportation strategy to consider more closely the feasibility of operating shuttle buses from these establishments to Kingsford.

Congratulations on being elected to serve on Aberdeen City Council for the Kingswells, Sheddocksley and Summerhill ward.

As you are aware, Aberdeen Football Club has submitted a planning application for a world-class community sports hub, football training academy and new stadium at Kingsford and we would like to take this opportunity to highlight the key issues for the Club and the socio-economic benefits it will bring to Aberdeen.

The planning application to Aberdeen City Council for the 25.5 hectare site at Kingsford includes community and sports facilities; a football academy comprising outdoor pitches, pavilion and ancillary buildings; and a 20,000-seat capacity stadium along with associated access roads, parking, landscaping and engineering works.

Subject to planning approval, the proposals will see more than £50 million invested to create a new home for the Dons; provide a base for the significant expansion of the award-winning work of Aberdeen FC Community Trust and create a focal point for footballing excellence in the North of Scotland.

Furthermore, at a time when participation in sport is being encouraged by Government to promote health and wellbeing, we believe the creation of best-in-class outdoor sporting facilities will complement the fantastic indoor and aquatic facilities provided by Aberdeen Sports Village and ensure that the city's profile as a hub for sporting excellence is dramatically raised.

This private-sector investment and the new jobs it will create will send out a strong signal of confidence in the region which has been severely affected by the oil and gas downturn, and when combined with other sporting facilities in the city, this will make the North-east a sporting powerhouse.

The restrictions of the Club's no longer fit-for-purpose Pittodrie Stadium, including the inability to develop co-located and dedicated training facilities, are an increasing barrier to the Club's sustainable future.

The Club ensures the city and the wider region is profiled nationally and internationally and Aberdeen FC has further ambitious plans to enhance our reputation as a visionary organization, competing successfully in domestic and European competition, with first class facilities for our supporters, staff and players at all ages.

We cannot deliver this, nor be a positive role model for young people, within the current infrastructure at an aged Pittodrie Stadium. Equally, without suitable training and community facilities – a prerequisite for every professional football club – we will be unable to compete at the highest levels of Scottish and European football.

The Community Trust provides support and opportunity for people of all ages, and often to those in greatest need of a helping hand. Working in partnership with charities and public sector organisations, and our supporters, we deliver award-winning inclusion, health and wellbeing programmes. The Trust cannot increase the scope of this work without dedicated facilities and the development would enable it to extend its positive impact in the region and create new ways of engaging with multiple stakeholder groups.

We previously held a number of briefings for local and national politicians and, would be willing to organize another round of fact-finding sessions for Aberdeen City Councillors, particularly newly elected, and will be in contact in due course with a view to arranging there.
