


What can you do?

If you see anyone deliberately setting off the fire alarm system, please contact Police Scotland on 101 or CrimeStoppers anonymously on 0800 111 555.

For a free home safety visit from the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service, call 0800 0731 999 or text 'fire' to 80800.



- Do not store goods in drying rooms, electrical cupboards and other communal areas - they increase the risk of fire and make it difficult for fire crews to rescue people



- If you're a council tenant, you can get four bulky uplifts a year free of charge



- Tell us about broken locks to drying rooms or electrical cupboards or rubbish and items being stored in communal areas at

What can you do?



- Please park in marked areas only - the hatched areas are for emergency vehicles only



- Keep rubbish bags in your flat until you're ready to take them to bin room - leaving them outside your door is a fire risk



- When disposing of rubbish in the chutes, use suitable bags and tie securely to reduce spillage and dust



- Do not smoke or vape in communal areas. The building is fitted with a fire detection system for your safety and protection

Working together

Following the Grenfell Fire in June 2017, there has been an increased level of scrutiny focusing on high rise accommodation.

We are taking a proactive approach with the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service to make sure residents are aware of the steps they can take to keep their homes, safe, secure, and protected.

Facts...



There are 4,460 flats in 59 multi storey buildings in Aberdeen.



Each year, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service attends in excess of **500** false smoke alarm call outs.



False alarm call outs costs **£2,000** each to the SFRS - **that's £1 million** each year.



The police also must attend at **£1,000** each time. That's a further **£500,000**.

Causes of false alarms



- People setting off alarms deliberately



- People smoking in communal areas, hallways and drying rooms



- Fire alarms being triggered due to cooking



- Contractors working within buildings creating dust and fumes due to cutting and solvents



- Electrical faults in washing machines, dishwashers and tumble driers

Did you know?



- All multi storey buildings are protected by fire and smoke detection sensor systems for your safety



- The fire and smoke detection sensor system triggers when smoke or fumes escape into the communal drying rooms, hallways, and stairways



- Smoking and vaping will trigger the sensors



- Regular fire safety inspections are carried out



- The sensors activate a callout to the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service but will not sound the alarm in the building



- If the sensors are triggered by a false alarm, the lifts will be out of operation for up to an hour



- There are mains-wired alarms in almost all flats and in all communal areas



- Mains-wired alarms in communal areas are tested weekly, quarterly and annually
