

Thank you for your information request of 22 April 2019 and please accept our sincere apologies for delay in getting back to you. Aberdeen City Council (ACC) has completed the necessary search for the information requested.

1. I would also like to know how many complaints that Aberdeen City Council has received about LED street light since January 2018.

There have been no complaints received regarding LED streetlighting since January 2018.

We follow the Scottish Local Authority Complaints Handling Procedure, which was introduced in 2012. Under this procedure, a 'complaint' is defined as "an expression of dissatisfaction regarding our actions, or lack of action, or the standard of service provided by us or on our behalf". There are some topics that cannot be considered as a 'complaint', such as a first-time request for a service or a general enquiry.
