 We have 14 schools with their own bike fleets, but also have a central pool held by the outdoor learning team. Sport Aberdeen (Adventure Aberdeen) who deliver the staff training also have a fleet of bikes which can be rented if required for a fee.

Aberdeen city in association with external providers also offers Go Mountainbike, and Velotech maintenance courses at schools. We also run bike maintenance classes at the Cummings Park Community Centre, and have incorporated cycling into the AMPED project, which is a citywide employability project on vehicle mechanics for school pupils age 14 – 17. There is an in house training and accreditation scheme for staff who want to take pupils cycling on cycle tracks or paths.
