For each, the Route-map sets out challenges and problems Aberdeen City faces within each area. It considers the range of technical and behavioural solutions required to reduce emissions associated with each theme, and outlines how to deliver multiple co-benefits, including improving the natural environment and reducing inequalities. The content is considered to be high level and does not specify projects or proposals. If individual projects were to come forward following publication of the Route-map these would have to be individually assessed in terms of their requirements for Environmental Assessment. This PPS is not likely to have significant effects on the environment. For this reason we will not undertake a further SEA.
