Our total emissions for 2022/23 were 27,504 tCO2e


This shows a 10% decrease (3,149 tCO2e) from pre pandemic levels 2019/20

Our emissions are on track to achieve our interim target of a 48% reduction by 2025



Our emissions have **reduced by 41%** against reporting baseline of 2015/16

Overall Emissions By Source (tCO2e) 2022-23:





Emissions rose by 5% in 2022/23 due to the addition of **District Heating emissions** to the total. Without this addition, 2022/23 emissions would show as 26,007 tCO2e, a reduction of 0.6%

tCO2e stands for tonnes of Carbon Dioxide equivalent. This is a standard unit to quantify greenhouse gas emissions. 1tCO2e is the average emissions of one passenger on a return-flight from Paris to New York.

All figures are rounded to the nearest whole number.

BUILDINGS



92 new Gold Standard homes completed at Auchmill, which are connected to the district heating network

Council won 'Local Authority Fleet Operator of the Year' for commitment to sustainable fleet vehicles 88% of fleet is now low emission (EV H2 Dual Fuel and/or Euro 6) 25% of Council's external passenger transport providers use low emission vehicles

OTHER OPERATIONS



The Strategic Tree & Woodland Implementation Plan approved

40 'It's Your Neighbourhood' groups now formed. *More than any other Council.*

A range of awards including 9 Green Flags for well managed parks & green spaces

Following storms, high risk damaged trees cleared, felled and restocked.
Plus over 400 street trees planted.

LED Streetlighting Replacement Programme **completed**. *Estimated to save 400 tCo2e per year.*

LEADERSHIP & GOVERNANCE



Council approved capital investments towards net zero and climate resilience, including an £800,000 programme to support of the Council's Climate Change Plan

Net Zero Environment and Transport Committee established to monitor delivery of Council environmental targets and the meeting of related statutory obligations The Council responded to the global climate change and nature loss crises by declaring a climate and nature emergency

AWARENESS & BEHAVIOUR CHANGE



Climate Week North-East 2023: **8 Council teams** hosted **11 events** with **over 600 attendees**, working in partnership with **13 organisations**

Green Champions Network has grown from 63 to **75 members**, participating in **8 activities**. e.g., Workplace food growing, 'repair what you wear' workshops.
